Rifle

This month, the rifle committee is hosting three special events. The first two are on the same day, Sunday, July 14. The first is an M1 Carbine match. It is a 40-round match at 100-yards with an additional 10-sighter shots. The course-of-fire includes standing, slow prone, rapid prone, and sitting position shooting. The cost is \$25 for adults & \$15 for juniors. Squadding begins at 11:30 a.m. with the first relay beginning at noon. There are CMP award pins for those who earn them. And since you are already at the range you should stick around for the second match - which is a Vintage Military Rifle match. This includes M1 Garand, 1903 and 03A3 Springfield, M1917 Enfields and foreign military bolt action rifles. This match squads at 2:30 p.m. with shooting beginning at 3 p.m. It is a 40-round match with an additional 5-

sighter shots. The position are standing, slow prone and rapid prone. Achievement pins will also be awarded to those that earn them. The fees are also \$25 for adults & \$15 for juniors.

The third special event this month is the 2019 Michigan Smallbore Silhouette Rifle Championship. This is a two-day event. Saturday, July 27 is the Smallbore Standard Rifle match with the Hunting Rifle match on Sunday. This is a regulation NRA Smallbore Silhouette. Practice starts at 9 a.m. each day with the matches starting at 10:30 a.m. The fee for adults is \$30 and \$15 for juniors. A second rifle is \$20. There are awards for the class winners. If you don't want to shoot it, you might just want to come and check it out. There are usually some pretty good silhouette shooters at this event.

Finally, here is your Black Powder note of the month. Black Powder is not as hard on your hearing as are modern centerfire rifles. Frequently, I only use ear plugs while shooting black powder. I don't need the plugs/muffs combo that I need on the rifle range. Black powder is not as hard on your hearing for two reasons. The barrels are longer so the sound source is farther from your ear but more importantly, the velocities are a lot lower, the sound is more of a push than a jab. The roof at the rifle range tends to hold the sounds in place whereas if you are out in the open the sound has a chance to dissipate. The use of muzzle breaks is increasing on the rifle range and those are REALLY loud.

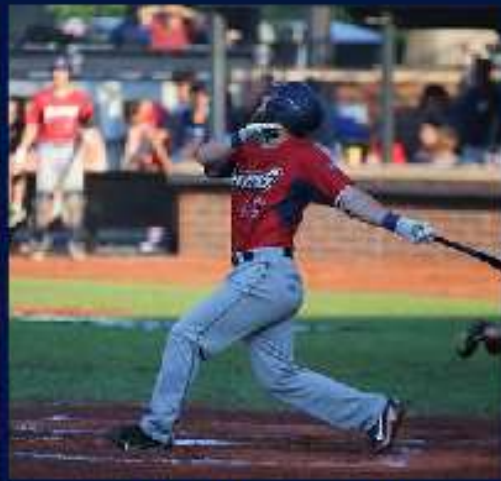

Cowboy

The US Cavalry (1865-1890) – Notable Leaders

“General George Crook” (1828-1890).

Unorthodox, courageous, and resourceful, **George Crook** was known among his Native American foes as **“Gray Fox”**. Crook was a career Army officer who commanded an Ohio regiment at the beginning of the Civil War. Around 1867, he was assigned to the West where General Sheridan command-



of **Apaches**. Two keys to Crook’s success against various hostile tribes were his use of **pack trains**, which provided more greater mobility in the field than wagon trains, and the **liberal employment of Native American Scouts** who were eager to settle old scores with enemy tribes. Crook was an avid outdoor enthusiast, sometimes ranging ahead of his column on solitary hunting and scouting forays. His personal explorations familiarized him with the terrain where he would campaign, and he regularly provided fresh meat to his comrades. A steady man, Crook fought Indians but also tried desperately to get the government to live up to the promises it made to the Native Americans. In 1888, Crook was promoted to major general, but two years later he died at age 60. Some of his former Native American opponents wept at the news, and the **Lakota Chief, Red Cloud, stated, “he never lied to us”**. General George Crook is buried at Arlington National Cemetery.

ed the Dept. of the Missouri. As an innovative young officer, he learned to fight frontier-style, emulating the guerilla tactics of the Native American warriors and living off the land while in the field. Other unprecedented practices for the times included drilling his soldiers and instructing them in shooting at targets. Most famously, **Crook fought Apaches** in the early 1870s, then the **Lakota at the June 1876 Battle of the Rosebud**. In 1882, he was transferred back to Arizona to find **Geronimo and his band**

Moment of Silence: A Moment of Silence was held for members David Roddy and Gene Adam.

Special Guest: Kim Enders from the Shelby Community Foundation presented the DSC \$1,000 Scholarship to Adriana Jarrett.

Presidents Report: (R. Savo) Past President and the Life Members were recognized. • The septic system has been installed at Sporting Clays. The water table is only 18 inches underground. The septic tanks have to go down 8 feet. We had three pumps working overtime to keep the water pumped out so we could line the bottom of the hole with crushed stone • The steel building is still moving forward. We are still waiting for a soil erosion inspection. • The LED lighting in the basement range is done. • Florence Concrete is installing the batch plant with us again this year. • Mr. Saylor has built two additional pistol bays (bays eight and nine) for the USPSA match. One is a chronometer bay to make sure the ammo used in the match is of the proper power level. • The concrete on the 50-yard pistol range has been removed. • There will be no July General Membership meeting. Please come out and help with the fireworks parking.

Secretary's Report: (R. Hegelman) The May GM Meeting minutes are on the table by the door and in the book behind the bar, as are the April BOD Meeting minutes.

Treasurers Report: (D. Purdie) The financial results for April 2019 are available. Our YTD income for April is \$416,094.09. YTD expenses were \$300,915.68. The YTD net through April is \$115,178.41. Income for the month of April was \$104,926.87. Expenses for April are \$59,016.20. April net is \$45,910.67. • Our loan balance is \$112,954.89. This is a good thing, and the numbers seem to be trending up as the spring and summer business increases. We sign checks weekly for between \$16K and \$18K. Today was an exception as I signed checks for \$50,782. • The Pro Shop is ahead for the year by \$4,000. • The BOD has a responsibility to look forward at upcoming expenses. However if the proper procedures are not followed, such as a motion brought up that the Trustees have never even seen, it causes everything to come to a stop. If your venue has expenses planned, the proper procedures must be followed, otherwise we are unable to consider the motion as submitted. • The financial reports are in a book behind the bar if you want to take a look at them.

1st Vice President's Report: (J. Estes) I am the Chairman of the Grounds and Planning committee. We have a lot of painting that needs to be done around the club. We also need to have the ground raked so we can plant grass. We also need to have some concrete work done. • We have an erosion problem with the ground behind the office. It is caused by the culvert going under Dequindre road. The county inspector was supposed to come out and look at it and send us a letter outlining what has to be done, but he has not come out yet to do his job. • The Planning committee is working on replacing the sidewalks on skeet and trap at they need replacement. • The fireworks event is on June 26. We need volunteers to assist setup the day before, assist parking during the fireworks event, and the day after the event for clean-up. The next Life Membership meeting and dinner is June 9 at 2 p.m. in the clubhouse.

2nd Vice Presidents Report: We will be closing the ranges at 4 p.m. for the fireworks June 26. We had an interesting incident report. Mr. Estes opened the cowboy range for practice one day and found a bicycle chained to a support. Mr. Estes walked around and could not find the owner so he opened the range. Shortly thereafter the owner walked from the top of the berm down to the bullet impact area to retrieve his bicycle while the range was hot. Mr. Estes called an immediate cease fire and he and another member escorted the owner off the range. While the owner was apparently incoherent it seems that he is a local person. It must be stressed that this could happen on any of our ranges. We will be on the lookout for this person and we will take steps so he is not on our property. This was a scary incident, but no one was hurt it turned out OK. • With the non-ending rain we cannot get our mowers to cut the grass. If the grass is too tall, get with your committee as push mowers and weed whackers will work on the worst areas until we can get mowers out. Also the mosquitos and ticks are thriving we are looking at using insecticides. If you are using them, make sure to use them according to the directions on the container. Otherwise things are going well.

Trustees Report: Nothing to report.

Chairman's Report: (J. Lupi) The BOD met on May 20 and there was considerable discussion on using the procedures already in place such as filling out POs, RABs, and the motions that come with it. We, at the BOD level we are seeing people putting substantial expenses on their credit cards and them coming to the business office and asking for payment. As your elected representatives we are charged with the responsibility of making sure there is a paper trail for every expenditure of this club. Without a PO, a RAB, and a motion tied to those documents, the business will not release any funds, as charged by the BOD. At the chairman's meeting I explained our procedure with POs and release against budget. It was made crystal clear to the committee chairs at the meeting what is going to happen if a motion comes to the BOD without the Trustees having seen the PO and the RAB. It will be postponed.
