Archery

September means the 3-D archery target season is winding to an end and hunters are preparing for the start of the Michigan archery deer season. If you are one of those planning to head into the woods in October, be sure to come out to the archery range and ensure you are tuned up.

The 3-D course and practice range are open every weekend in September up until we close it down Sept 28. If you are planning to use a crossbow, we have targets that can be used with crossbows on the target range. Sorry, no crossbows are allowed on the 3-D course.

September events include the Monday evening archery 3-D Fall League. If you are not in the league, you can still come out and shoot at the guest rate. Monday evenings will also include the option of shooting the 3-D course or the broadhead course. If you want to practice

shooting broadheads before October, this is a great opportunity. The Monday Fall League, which started July 28, does not shoot on Labor day and finishes Sept. 23 with a banquet and prizes.

CPL Practice to Resume

Concealed Pistol License (CPL) practice will resume on designated Sunday evenings from 5 to 7 p.m. starting Oct. 13, for intermediate shooters, and Oct. 27, for basic shooters.

This year, the Novice Orientation will be held Oct. 20, from 5 to 7 p.m. Practices will be held in the months of October, November, December, 2019; and January, February, March, and April, 2020.

The trainings are held in the basement range and are limited to club members who hold a Michigan CPL permit. Practices are scheduled as follows:

2nd Sunday of every month - Intermediate Shooters. Persons who have been previously designated as intermediate level, or who were regular

attendees to last year's basic level practice sessions and were upgraded to Intermediate level at the conclusion of last season.

4th Sunday of every month - Basic Shooters. Persons who attend the Oct. 20 orientation, and begin their practice session the following week. It also includes last year's basic level shooters who were not regular attendees to the practice.

Oct. 20, 5-7 p.m.- Novice Orientation. Orientation for persons who haven't attended the practice must attend prior to attending their first practice. There is no exception to this policy for any reason. Orientation is held once a year.

Notable Military Leaders, Indian Wars

General Ranald Slidell Mackenzie

(July 27, 1840-Jan. 19, 1889)

Nickname: "Bad Hand Mackenzie" was a career United States Army Officer and General in the Union Army during the American Civil War. He was described by Ulysses S. Grant as its most promising young officer. He also served with great distinction in the Indian Wars. His wounding at Jerusalem Plank Road during the siege of Peters-

burg, during the Civil War, cost him the first two fingers of his right hand and was the probable cause of his nickname **Bad Hand**. The American Indians referred to him as **No-Finger Chief**.

After the Civil war, Mackenzie remained in the regular army and reverted to his permanent rank of captain in the Army

The DSC hosted the Michigan Rifle and Pistol Association State Championship for smallbore silhouette July 27-28. The weather was hot and the wind was blowing. There were 17 competitors from all over Michigan and from Canada, too.

Smallbore silhouette is a competition to shoot at and knock over small steel silhouettes of various animals (chickens, pigs, turkeys, rams) at ranges of 40 to 100 meters using rifles in .22 LR. It can be very challenging. Even so, the DSC was well represented in winners circle. In the Hunter Rifle category, Associate member, Deon Germishuizen was the match winner but Mike Lucas was declared the State champion

in the Hunter category as the rules state that one must be a resident of Michigan for that honor. Rich Franke and Gary Dawson ran the match flawlessly and they would like to thank Jim Estes and Tom Van Hove for their efforts in range preparation. There are three upcoming events that may be of interest to the rifle readers. DSC is hosting a Sporting Goods show at the clubhouse Saturday Sep. 7. Black Powder

This is an informal shoot with the course of fire being 15 steel targets at distances of 25 to 60 yards hanging semi-hidden in the woods. Be there at 9:45 a.m. for the safety briefing and shooting will start at roughly 10 a.m. It's a lot of fun and it's a good chance to bring out that old muzzleloader that you haven't shot in a while. Practice occurs Friday nights from 7: 30 to 9:30 p.m. September through July.

During the past two decades, our team has earned many victory titles including the NRA/VFW National Postal Championship for six years in a row. Our competitive team is well known and many members have been invited to attend the U.S. Olympic Training Center in Colorado for the U.S. Junior Olympic Smallbore and Air Rifle competitions. Corps of Engineers. Promoted in 1867 to Colonel of the **Buffalo Soldiers' 41st U. S. Infantry**, which two years later became the **famous 24th Infantry**. He assumed command of the regiment at Fort Richardson in Jacksboro, Texas. His mission was to destroy and relocate the Comanches back to Fort Sill in Oklahoma Territory. He proved himself the era's most effective Indian fighter at the **Battle of Blanco Canyon** and the **Battle of North Fork** in the unforgiving plains of Llano Estacado of West Texas. One of his most infamous punitive raids happened Sep. 28, 1874, when he led his forces 1,000 feet into the Palo Duro Canyon on an Indian trail so steep the soldiers had to lead their horses single file. Instead of following the fleeing Comanche, Kiowa,

Shooters need only supply eye and ear protection, as club pistols and club subsidized ammunition are available for use at this activity.

Participation is limited to those young shooters who have already completed a Basic NRA Pistol Class, or began shooting last season with the understanding that they would enroll in the next scheduled Basic Pistol Class.

New shooters can join in the fun and start shooting now with the understanding that they will enroll in the next Junior Basic Pistol Class, scheduled to take place Jan. 3, 10, 17, 24, 31 and Feb. 7, 2020.

Southern Cheyenne and Arapaho Indians, Mackenzie captured and killed 1,500 to 2,000 of their horses, ponies and mules. Left horseless and starving, unable to hunt, the tribes all returned to the reservation by February 1875.

By 1883, physically wounded seven times, 43 years of age, Brigadier General Mackenzie now suffered psychological wounds, losing his mind, which some attribute to a severe fall from a wagon at Fort Sill in Oklahoma Territory. He was returned to his native New York, committed to an asylum, and retired from the U. S. Army. Mackenzie died at his sister's home on Jan. 19, 1889. He was interred in West Point Cemetery, N.Y.
