# **Black Powder**

This is a quiet month for Black Powder. There is the usual Tuesday mini-Rendezvous and the monthly woods walk is scheduled Dec. 8. There are also opportunities to shoot Monday evenings on the basement range from 6 - 8 p.m.

Since there is not a lot to report on the shooting range, let's examine another aspect of BP shooting – patch lube. Last month, we told you where to get patching material cheap (i.e. Joann Fabrics). This month, we will discuss what to put on them. We start with the oldest lube – spit. There is nothing wrong with spit. Lots of good shooters use it religiously. Its big advantage is that it is free and readily available. While it

works, it is neither the best lubricant nor cleaner. The remaining patch lubes fall into either of those two categories. The lubricant type works by keeping the powder fouling soft and this aids cleaning. The cleaner type aids cleaning but also helps keeps the fouling soft. Typical of the lubricant type are products with the words “wonder” and “1000” in the name. I don't have much experience with these but their popularity is undeniable. On the cleaner side, are products such as Hoppes Black Powder Bore Cleaner and Patch Lubricant. Very popular, is a product that is half way between these two - Ballistol or Moose Milk (a mixture of Ballistol in water). Ballistol is the original CLP (Cleans,

Lubricants, Protects) product from Germany. I see this product on the line often and the users are usually quite fond of it. I have tested Moose Milk versus the Hoppes mentioned above in my 50 cal. Tenn. Mountain rifle. The edge in group size went to the Hoppes but the difference was very small. My recommendation is to try out these products and see what works best for you and your gun. Note that in addition to group size, ease of loading would be the other factor to consider. In other words, how long can I go before I need to clean the bore. Let me know your favorite patch lube recipe.

## **Rifle**

There are three big events for Rifle Committee in December.

The first is the annual Toys for Tots Turkey Shoot on the basement range Tuesday, Dec. 3 from 6—8 p.m. This is a fun shoot for rimfire rifles and pistols. Bring a new, unwrapped toy to donate.

The second is the league banquet Saturday, Dec. 7. Festivities begin at 6 p.m. with dinner at 7 p.m. After that we will honor the award winners from all the summer leagues. As usual, there will be a raffle at the banquet for two rifles.

The third event is a classic. It's the 18th Annual Christmas Cookie Shoot. This will be held Dec. 22 from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m.. In this event, you use your rimfire rifles (17s, 22LR and Mags) to shoot at Christmas cookie at 50 yards.

Shooting is done from the sitting position. More information on these events can be found on the DSC website “Coming Events’ page.

We still have open shooting outdoors this winter Sundays from 11 a.m. - 3 p.m. However, there are two indoor events that I would like to bring to your attention.

First, you can shoot 22s Monday afternoons from 2-4 p.m. with the Senior small-bore people.

Another opportunity is the Rimfire Sporter league. This match follows the CMP rimfire sporter course of fire. The first shoot is Dec. 1. Most shoots will be on the first or third Sunday of the month on the basement range from 6 - 8 p.m.

The rifle committee range rules were recently revised. Two changes should be noted

by all DSC rifle shooters. The first is that starting April 1, open shooters will be required to case and uncase firearms on the line. This change is to aid safety as customers have sometimes brought loaded firearms to the range and it was not discovered until the action was opened on the line. Hopefully, this rule change will help prevent the accidental sweeping of the line with a loaded rifle that has sometimes happened in the past.

Additionally Empty Chamber Indicators (ECIs) will be required for open shooting. The rifle committee plans to supply these at no cost. There will be a transition period from January through March.

## Famous Outlaws and Lawmen of the Old West

There is much legend surrounding American History of the Wild West when it comes to American outlaws and lawmen. On occasion, the two were interchangeable. For example, a lawman might have previously been a bandit in another state. On the other hand, a lawman may have subsequently become an outlaw. Beginning with the January 2020 P & K we will profile some famous

trains and stagecoaches. Some individuals, like Jesse James, became outlaws after serving in the Civil War. Some were simply men who took advantage of the “wildness and lawlessness” of the frontier to enrich themselves at the expense of others. Law was present, but spread thin, in the American Old West. It was usually present on three levels: (1) Deputy U. S. Sheriff; (2) County Sheriff and (3) Town Marshall or Constable. When an outlaw committed a crime, the local sheriff or marshall would usually form a posse to attempt to capture them. Rewards were posted



outlaws and lawmen of the “American Wild West”. The majority of outlaws in the Old West preyed on banks,

# DSC General Membership Monthly Meeting

Nov. 6, 2019—Clubhouse 8:00 pm

**Pledge of Allegiance:** R. Savo

**Conservation Pledge:** R. Savo

**Presidents Report:** (R. Savo) Past President and the Life Members were recognized. • Mr. Savo recognized and thanked the Veterans that were present for their service. The erosion repair has begun. The slide between the office and clubhouse has been filed in. It is on halt because we are waiting for concrete from the last road projects still under way in the area. What we have used is probably only 10% of the total project. • After a three year journey the barn replacement building construction has begun. The concrete contractor will need about two weeks, weather permitting, to dig and pour the footers, piers, set the anchor bolts and the floor. Concrete needs to set up about two weeks and then the steel can be erected. With any luck, about the middle of December the building should be standing. We won't start electrical work until after the first of the year and fully be done by spring. • The walkways for the clubhouse have been completed. The ramp will be delayed until spring 2020 because of lack of help and conserving cash for the new building. • We are installing gutters on the clubhouse this week. We must stop the water that is running off the roof and getting into the basement. • The landscaping continues and what we don't get done now will be completed in the spring. • Dave Oles is continuing to remodel the kitchen backroom in preparation for the new commercial dishwasher which we will install. He and his helpers have done a great job so far. • Don't forget to visit the Women of Aim bake sale table. Contributions benefit the Kids Christmas Part on Dec. 21. • Preparations are under way for the club wide Member Appreciation Party to take place on Dec. 29.

**Secretary's Report:** (R. Hegelman) The September BOD Meeting minutes and the October GM meeting minutes are on the table by the door and in the book behind the bar.

**Treasurers Report:** (D. Purdie) The financial results for August 2019 are available. Our YTD income for September is \$887,645.60. YTD expenses were \$786,842.57. The YTD net through September is \$100,803.03. Income for the month of September was \$106,492.33. Expenses for September were \$98,383.72. The September net was \$8,108.61. • This week I signed checks for \$29,552.01 and the Trustees and BOD have approved \$191K in expenditures. • Our loan balance is \$101,689.09. The financial reports are in a book behind the bar if you want to take a look at them. • Discussion followed regarding the total costs of the new building.

**1<sup>st</sup> Vice President's Report:** (J. Estes) As you know, I am responsible for grounds and planning. We had a culvert fail on the back of the berm which drains the rifle and pistol range water. It caused erosion of the back of the berm, and water is running over the road in Sporting Clays. We spent over \$5K in materials needed to fix it and work is under way. When finished the new culvert drain system will direct the water to the Clinton River. • The campground received their seatainer to store their equipment in rather than leaving it exposed to the elements. The cost was \$2500. They also need a new office building. We are getting prices on a new zero turn mower. That will cost around \$12K. • The 200-yard backstop on the rifle range needs to be rebuilt. Next year the costs estimated at \$80K-95K and could rise as high as \$250K. The Life Member Sporting Goods Show was very successful. • The Cowboys are hosting a service rifle match on Nov. 10. They have a Cowboy match on Nov. 16. Our Cowboy practices are now from 10 a.m. to noon on Saturdays. • Getting back to grounds and planning; the berms are very expensive to maintain. Just to give you an example; we had to replace a drainage pump on the rifle range. We had to replace both the pump as well as the control panel and it cost us \$49,700.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Vice Presidents Report:** (J. Rhodes) We had no incident reports this month. There was a person who fell down the stairs leading to the basement range in the Shotgun building. He was lucky, just some bumps and bruises. His fall did some minor damage to the range door, but is easily fixed. Please remember to seep the stairway clear of any trip hazards. Keep it clean and well lit. • Please take the usual winter precautions. Keep the walkways clear of snow and ice. • Please remember that no private classes or lessons to be given on our ranges. All classes are a function of the club and the club only.

**Trustees Report:** (E. Silarski) Mr. Silarski covered the responsibilities of the committees to review and return their budgets, inventories, SOP's etc. He covered the return dates and pointed out that these are must items and must be in to the Trustees, Office, and BOD for further review on time. (T. Young) Nothing to report. (D. Burnett) Nothing to report.

**Chairman's Report:** (J. Lupi) Mr. Lupi covered the seven motions that were brought up for consideration at the October BOD meeting. The total cost of these motions is \$130,200.00 due to the \$90,000.00 cost of the concrete foundation for our new building as well as \$36,200 to erect the building. Mr. Lupi reported the six nominees for the open position on the BOD. • The SOP committee is composed of Chairman of the BOD, the President, two members of the BOD, and one club member at large. The names are Mr. Lupi, Mr. Savo, Mr. Murphy, Mr. Burnett, and Mr. Bolterstein. Their last meeting was in January. After the election, the chairman will appoint a new SOP committee which will probably meet next January.

**Operations Manager Report:** (B. Palmer) Ms. Palmer informed the members of the 2020 DSC pen sale. She walked around and sold out all of them to the members. • Ms. Palmer thanked Mr. Phil Finazzo for his work every Friday assisting the cleaning of several of our buildings.
