Black Powder

It's pretty quiet on the black powder range this month. There is still shooting Monday nights on the base-ment range and there is the usual mini-rendezvous Tues-days but there is no monthly Woods Walk this month. There is a special shoot Satur-day, Jan. 25. This is the Trade Gun Round Robin. Trade Guns as you know are flint-lock smoothbore long guns generally in the 20-12 gauge range. They have no rear sight but are allowed an aim-ing mark at the front. The competition includes hanging steel targets shoot with round balls and clay birds shot shotgun style. In addi-tion, the competition includes tomahawk and knife throwing and fire building. Period dress is required for this event for participation. Spec-tators are welcome.

The December Woods walk was held Sunday, Dec. 8. Nine shooters attended . The

winner was Larry Mobley shooting 13 out of 15. Next there was a three way tie at 10. These were Adam Sass, Charley Naylor and Sherry MacGregor. Note that Adam was at some disadvantage as he was shooting a smooth-bore fowler with only a front sight. Fun was had by all.

Finally, the technical topic for the month is "Flint versus Percussion". The old timers in the audience know all the positive and negatives of shooting these two ignition systems. For new shooters, I recommend percussion cap ignition. There is a lot to learn in starting out in black powder; patches, projectiles, patch lubes, cleaning, etc. I recommend percussion to start as it is simpler to learn. A good caplock will go bang nearly every time. Even a mediocre caplock will also. A well tuned flintlock will also but that comes with experi-ence. A flint shooter needs to

learn how to pick good flints and fit them correctly, how to pick the vent hole and how much priming powder to place and where. If it's a good lock, the process goes pretty well. If it's a mediocre flintlock..... it can be frus-trating. Thus its better that new shooters start with a caplock to learn the basics. When they are confident of the other parameters in black powder shooting, flintlocks will be an easy natural pro-gression. I shoot both but I prefer the caplock for its sim-plicity. However, its inter-esting to note that flintlock shooters frequently give that same reason for why they shoot flintlocks (no caps to mess with or buy, etc.). Whatever ignition system you like, please come out some-time and try it out on a Woods walk!

Planning & Grounds

In the last Grounds and Planning article, I stated that all the permits were in place for the new storage building. As I write this, the building is in the second day of assembly. The assembly should have finished Dec. 20. The next step is installing electrical power for lighting and outlets. Once that is completed, we can get the final inspection and start moving in. At this time, the total amount expended for the building is about \$200,000.

Both land slide projects are on hold until spring. About 600-yards of broken concrete was dumped over the fence next to the office. This concrete has corrected the slide on the east side for the office. In the spring, more broken concrete will be dumped down the hill on the west side of the office to correct that slide. Work has started on the slide by sporting clays station #3. Some of the rusted pipe has been removed and a ditch has been dug to route the water away from the sporting clays driveway. Material has been purchased for the sporting clays land slide job at a cost of \$5,000. This project will continue in the spring.

The next project will be moving out of the old barn. Once this barn is empty, it must be torn down. That is the agreement on the permit to construct the new steel building.

Let's not forget about the campground. A new office building and an electric gate are needed at the campground. More on those projects in the future. Jim Estes, 1st Vice President

Presidents Report: (R. Savo) Past President and the Life Members were recognized. • Mr. Savo recognized and thanked the Veterans that were present for their service. • As you might have noticed, the concrete floor for the new building is completed. It was poured and it passed inspection. Weather permitting, the erection of the steel building will start on Dec. 7. • We have two erosion problems. 

Famous Outlaws & Lawmen of the Old West

Pat Garrett (1850-1908)

Billy the Kid (1859-1881)

Nov. 2, 1880, **Pat Garrett** was elected Sheriff of Lincoln County, New Mexico. He was eager to capture the fugitive **William Bonney (a.k.a. Billy the Kid)**, and persuaded Sheriff George Kimball to appoint him a Deputy Sheriff. Garrett also obtained a U. S. Marshall's commission, which allowed him to pursue the **Kid** across county lines. Garrett formed a posse and stormed the Dedrick Ranch at Bosque Grande November 30, 1880. They expected to find the Kid there, but only succeeded in capturing two other associates. One John Joshua Webb, who had been charged with murder, and the other an accused horse thief named George Davis.

Dec. 19, 1880, Billy the Kid, and four of his companions rode into Fort Sumner. Lying in wait were deputy Garrett and his posse. The posse had mistaken Tom O' Folliard, one of the Kid's gang members, for the Kid and shot him dead. Billy the Kid and the others escaped

unharmd. Three days later, Garrett's posse cornered "Billy" and his three acquaintances at a spot called Stinking Springs. They killed one man and captured the others including "Billy the Kid". April 15, 1881, Billy the Kid was sentenced to hang, but he escaped 13 days later.

July 14, 1881, Garrett visited Fort Sumner to question a friend of the Kid's about his whereabouts and learned he was staying with a mutual friend, Pedro Menard, a.k.a. "Pete" Maxwell. About midnight Garrett went to Maxwell's house. The Kid was asleep in another part of the house but woke up in the middle of the night and entered Maxwell's bedroom, where Garrett was standing in the shadows. The Kid did not recognize who was standing in the dark and called out to him repeatedly, "Who is it?" Garrett replied by shooting him twice. The first shot hit the Kid in the chest just above the heart, killing him. by: Don Rybski
