## **Black Powder**

Back in March, just before the war started, we had the March Woods-Walk. It was well attended, with about 6 or 8 shooters. I decided to bring my flintlock as the regulars are frequently urging me to do. Now I have a very nice flintlock that was made for me by Jim Klein in the style of Jacob Dickert. I have shot it a few times and was beginning to think I was getting the hang of it. Well, I am, but not as fast as I thought. At the woods walk, I simply couldn't get the darn thing to go off. Sparking was excellent and there was a lot of "flash in the pan". Then I noted that it was difficult to pick the vent hole.....

THIS IS WHEN I LEARNED THE IMPORTANCE OF THE FOULING SCRAPER TOOL IN FLINTLOCK MAINTAINENCE. A scraper is a fitting for your ramrod that is basically a rectangular piece that fits the bore size. A typical one is shown here. It lets you scrape the fouling from the bottom of the barrel. And boy, did I scrape a lot of foul-

Now gentle reader, please note that I am adept at cleaning modern firearms and that I have no issues with my percussion gun either. In the case of the percussion gun, I use the plastic tube that fits in place of the nipple and allows a scrubbing motion in hot soapy water through the breech area. I get it clean. The evidence shows that in the few times I have been shooting my flintlock my cleaning has not been effective. I used patches and a brush. I thought I was getting everything clean. It turns out that this was not the case. I was doing a great job getting it about 90-95% Unfortunately, that other 5-10% was getting compacted in the breech. This did not really affect performance until this hard cake of carbon reached the vent hole. Then I was doomed as described above at the Woods Walk. After much with work the scraper (Thanks, Marty), I was able to get a lot of hard crusted carbon out. But it wasn't until I

got home and disassembled the rifle that I could really clean it. I put stockless barrel in a soapy water solution such that the vent was in the solution and was able to clean ala the percussion rifle cleaning method. As I cleaned, I even found a piece of a brass brush stuck in the carbon cake! The breech is now perfectly clean. It is not good practice to take your fancy flintlock apart like this

on a regular basis. So, the moral to the story is you need a scraper with your flintlock kit



to make sure you get all the carbon out. Flintlocks, there is so much to learn!

The DSC lost three long time members recently.


Philomena Gehringer was a DSC life member and was a camper for more than 30 years. She was well known for her famous spaghetti & meatball fundraiser dinners.
