

Famous Outlaws & Lawmen of the Old West JOHN WESLEY HARDIN-Outlaw (1853–1895)

Wes Hardin was an American Old West outlaw. He was one of the most prolific killers of the Old West. Hardin killed his first man at the age of 15 - pumped three slugs into the chest of a former slave. He claimed it was in self defense. He was pursued by lawmen for most of his life. In 1877, at age 23, he was arrested for murder. At the time of his sentencing, Hardin had claimed that he killed 42 men. Contemporary newspaper accounts, however, attribute only 27 deaths to him. In August 1871 in Abilene, Kansas, he is known to have killed a man in a bed, in a hotel room next to his, for snoring. As he saw J. B. Hickok approaching the hotel with four policeman, he escaped by leaping from a second story window of the hotel onto the roof then, onto the street where he hid in a haystack. In the morning, he stole a horse and rode to a cowcamp 35 miles outside town. It is believed that sometime later Hardin wrote, *"that if Wild Bill found*"

me in a defenseless condition he would take no explanation, but would kill me to add to his repuitation". There is another interesting anecdotal encounter between Hickok and Hardin. One night in Abilene, Kansas, Hardin was confronted by "Wild Bill" who told him that he was wearing guns in violation of town ordinance and was ordered to hand over his guns, which he did, but he did it in a quite surprising way. Hardin reached down, pulled his revolvers from the holsters, and handed the guns to Wild Bill butts forward, then swiftly rolled them over in his hands. Suddenly Wild Bill was staring right into the barrels. Both men, however, backed down. At the time, Hickok had no knowledge that Hardin was a wanted man traveling under the assumed name "Wesley Clemmons", so he just advised Hardin to avoid problems while in Abilene. In 1877, Hardin was arrested by a Texas Ranger. He was sentenced to 15 years in a Texas penitentiary. While in prison, he studied for the bar, wrote an autobiography and piously taught Sunday school. He won release from prison in 1892. He practiced law in Junction, Texas and married a young woman, who left him on the day of the wedding. Hardin became restless and

moved his practice to El Paso. He was a hard man and drank and caroused with a hard crowd. He clashed with Constable John Selman, who shot Hardin in the back August 19, 1895.


