CPL Practice

One-hour CPL practice sessions for Intermediate Shooters resumes on designated Sunday evenings at 5 p.m. and again at 6 p.m. commencing Oct. 11, 2020.

CPL practice for Basic Shooters runs from 5-7 p.m. on designated Sunday evenings beginning Oct. 25, 2020.

The Novice Orientation is Oct. 18, 2020 from 5 to 7 p.m. Practices this year will be held October 2020 through April, 2021.

Practices are in the basement range and are limited to club members who hold a Michigan CPL permit.

Practices schedule:

Oct. 18, 2020, 5-7 p.m. - Novice Orientation. This orientation is for persons who haven't previously attended any practice and must be taken prior to their first session. There is no exception to this policy for any reason and it is held once a year.

2nd Sunday of every month - Intermediate Shooters. These are shooters who have been previously designated as intermediate level or who were regular

attendees to last year's basic - level practice sessions and were upgraded to intermediate level at the conclusion of last season. As always, shooters must choose to attend either the 5 or 6 p.m. session and stick with that choice for the entire season.

4th Sunday of every month - Basic Shooters. These are persons who attend the Oct. 18 orientation and begin their practice session the following week. It also includes last year's basic level shooters who were not regular attendees to the practice.

Rifle

October is here and that means "Sight-In Season". The range is open longer hours and on more days.

The bulk of the rifle committee yearly income is made in October and November. If September open shooting is any indication, then October's should set records.

I helped RO Sept. 6 & 13. Both days we generated about 3 times the income of similar periods last year. Indeed, I can remember Sundays last year where we only had 10 shooters for the whole day. Sept. 13, we hosted 37 shooters!

Apparently, no football, no place to go and the fear of civil unrest has created huge demand for the rifle range. This is good news for the club

as this will help make up for the lost income from March-May.

However, there is one issue – Do we have enough rifle range officers to cover? If you are a rifle range officer, the committee can use your help this very busy season. If you are not a RO, this would be a good time to become a trainee. A considerable number of the new shooters we are seeing have little or no training with firearms or firearm safety and extra eyes on the range helps tremendously.

The rifle range backstop rebuild that was tentatively scheduled for next year has been rescheduled for July 2022 at the earliest. It will be an expensive project with

initial estimates ranging up to \$200,000.

The author would like to use this column for one request on the rebuild. It is tiresome in the extreme to continuously ask the incoming open shooters "What caliber are you using?" then calculating out whether it's a short target or a tall target needed, explaining to the shooter why it matters, stopping shooters in midsession because the wrong height target is being used, etc. Hopefully with the new backstop, we can tell them, "Here's your target frame, you are on lane 11 and be done with the Target Frame Height Kabuki Dance forever.

The Fall Skeet and Trap Fun Leagues are currently underway. Please check at the Pro Shop for information

Junior Shotgun is also continuing Sundays from 10:30 a.m. to 3 p.m.. Please contact Rick Stanfield or Bill Saylor regarding the schedule or for additional information.

One final item to report for this month – last, but certainly not least – is the 2020 DSC Skeet Championship, Sunday, Oct. 11. The shoot is open to all DSC members, so make plans to arrive around 10 a.m. and be ready to shoot several rounds of skeet in this "single-elimination" event! Famous Outlaws & Lawmen of the Old West:

"Bass Reeves" - Inspiration for the fictional character the **"Lone Ranger"**

Born July 1838 – Died January 12, 1910.

"Maybe the law ain't perfect, but it's the only one we got, and without it we got nuthin" – Bass Reeves

Bass Reeves was the first black deputy U.S. marshal west of the Mississippi River. In 1875, he was commissioned to be a deputy U.S. marshal by Federal Judge Isaac Parker, best remembered as the "Hanging Judge" for the high number of convictions of crimes punishable by death in his court.

Reeves was responsible for apprehending criminals in a 75,000 square-mile region of what is now mostly Oklahoma and Arkansas.

He was well known for his valor. As a U.S. marshal, he killed 14 outlaws in self-defense and apprehended more than 3,000 through his



tenure (including his own son).

Upon retirement in 1907, he became a city police officer in Muskogee, Okla.

While there is no definite proof of the connection, Reeves is sometimes speculated to have been the inspiration for the fictional character the Lone Ranger.

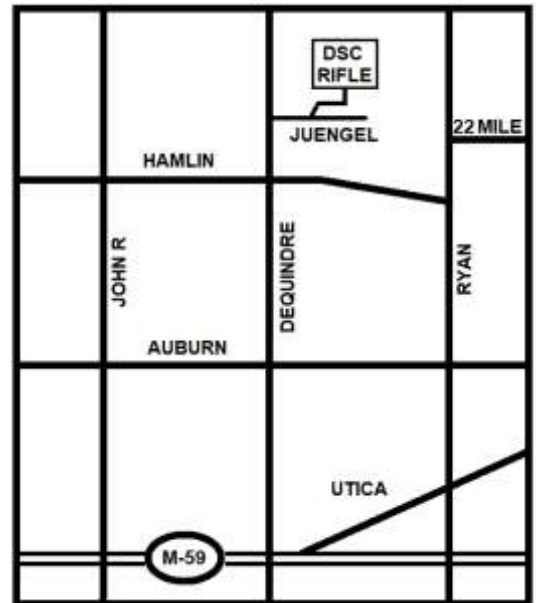
