Its mid-winter and with Covid, it is really quiet. I should be busy reloading cartridges for my modern rifles

but since rediscovering the joys of black powder, reloading modern ammunition has become more of a drudgery than a fun activity.

The image that comes to mind when you say reloading, is probably a guy sitting at his press adding powder or seating the bullet. That is the fun part but most of the work in reloading is associated with brass prep which can be rather tedious and tough on your hands and fingers.

You lube the case, size and deprime it. Clean the cases, trim them to length, chamfer the case mouth inside and then uniform/clean the primer pocket. I tire just explaining it. Timing my reloading process, it takes me about 75 seconds to reload one brass cartridge and you are pretty much stuck in the basement by yourself when you do.

It takes around a minute to reload your muzzleloader but you are usually outside chatting with friends and enjoying it as part of a wood walk or other event. There is a lot to like about black powder.

Judge Roy Bean – “The Law West of the Pecos”

Phantly Roy Bean Jr. (c. 1825 - March 16, 1903)

He was an American saloonkeeper and Justice of the Peace in Val Verde County, Texas who called himself “The Only Law West of the Pecos”. According to legend, he held court in his saloon located along the Rio Grande River on a desolate stretch of the Chihuahuan Desert of southwest Texas. After his death, Western films and books cast him as a hanging judge, although he is known to have sentenced only two men to hang, one of whom escaped. As a judge, Bean relied on only a single law book, the 1879 edition of the *Revised Statutes of Texas*. When newer law books arrived, he used them as kindling. Jurors, who were chosen from his best bar customers, were expected to buy a drink during every court recess. Justice of the Peace Roy Bean reigned as “Law West of the Pecos” for two decades. His methods of justice, carried out in his combination saloon/courtroom, were somewhat odd and always final. He was an unusual sort of judge. Examples of some of Judge Roy Bean’s uncommon rulings are as follows:

During construction of a bridge at Vinnegar-roon, Texas, a structure collapsed and 10 workers fell. Judge Roy Bean was called to the site to hold an inquest. Upon reviewing the accident, he pronounced all 10 men dead. However, only seven of them had actually been killed. When questioned on this point, the judge reasoned that the others would soon die and he did not want to make the trip twice. Fortunately, for the three men, he was wrong, and they survived to tell the tale.

During an inquest, a revolver and \$40 were found on the deceased. Judge Bean fined the corpse \$40 for carrying a concealed weapon and confiscated the revolver for use by the court.

Bean was infatuated with an actress named Lilly Langtry, also called “The Jersey Lilly.” He wrote the famous beauty that he had named his West Texas hamlet “Langtry” in her honor. When she offered to pay for a public drinking fountain, he politely declined: “*If there’s anything these hombres of Langtry don’t drink, it’s water.*”

As he aged, Bean spent much of his time on his porch with a shotgun in his arms and doing a lot of drinking and boasting. He was also known to help the poor in his area. After a heavy bout of drinking, Bean died in his saloon March 16, 1903 of lung and heart ailments. Sadly, he never met his fantasy woman Lilly Langtry. Almost a year after his death, Lilly Langtry finally visited his old home. On route from New Orleans to Los Angeles, she stopped to listen to the townspeople tell stories of Judge Roy Bean. Of the visit, she would later write. “It was a short visit, but an unforgettable one.”
