2021 DSC Scholarships

Sunday Jan. 31, DSC Rifle hosted the annual Ground Hog shoot. The simulated ground hogs were 2-liter pop bottles hanging from strings at the 200-yard line. Juniors shot at 500ml pop bottles at 50 yards using 22 rifles. Six bottles are required for each participant. This year the weather was cold and a little windy. Despite the weather, the turnout was great. There were 27 shooters in all and there were still two waiting to shoot when we shut down for open shooting. The top shooters were Tom Sullivan for least number of shots (10) and Gary Dawson for the least amount of time (3:46). In the junior category, the winners were Katie Clark for least rounds (7) and Michal Meyering for least time (0:20). Some wag was

there shooting a muzzleloader at the 50-yard targets. He did OK.

The next rifle special event is the Fred Wallwork Memorial Potato Shoot. In this event, we shoot at 6-potatoes hanging at 50-yards using 22 rifles. Firing is from the standing position except juniors may shoot off the benches. It is suggested that hollow point ammo be used as sometimes the hits with standard velocity solid points does not show much effect. The Shoot is Sunday, March 14 from 10 a.m. to noon. Rifle hosted their annual "Ground Hog" shoot Jan. 31. Targets are six 2-liter pop bottles hanging at 200 yards for the adults and 20 oz pop bottles hanging at 50 yards for the juniors. This year, I had the great idea to shoot my muzzleloader in this event. I shot the 20 oz bottles at 50 yards using my Tennessee Mountain Rifle. Why not? The 20 oz bottles are about the size of the novelty targets at the Muzzleloader shoots and 50 yards is well within the range of the TMR. I was able to hit all six bottles in 11 shots. This is not bad considering the actual winner, using a modern scoped rifle, finished one shot better at 10 shots. Now, it did take me more than 18 minutes for those 11 shots, so I don't ever expect to win the least time category. The reason I mention this here in the Black Powder article is that I would like to invite other BP enthusiasts to give this

Johnny Ringo (Outlaw) “A Gunslinger Who Could Quote Shakespeare”

Born: John Peters Ringo, May 3, 1850, Greens Fork, Indiana

Died: July 14, 1882 (age 32). Body Discovered: Turkey Creek Canyon, Arizona Territory

Everyone has heard of Wyatt Earp, Doc Holliday and the James Younger Gang. But, most of us know very little about the man whose story intersects with them. Cousin to both Younger and the James brothers, and for a time the chief antagonist of Wyatt Earp, Ringo has been somewhat overshadowed in history. But to those who have heard of Johnny Ringo know him as the fascinating figure that he was. He was an educated gunman who could spout Shakespeare, and who many writers romanticized as one of the deadliest gunfighters of the Old West. And to this day, only adding to the mystique of Johnny Ringo, is the fact that mystery surrounds his own death. A death as legendary as his mythic life. Ringo was born to a good family in 1850 in Greens Fork, Indiana. The family moved to Liberty, Missouri in 1856 where Ringo attended college. July 30, 1864, when Johnny was 14, his family was in Wyoming on route to California. His father, Martin Ringo, was killed when he jumped off their wagon while holding a shotgun, which accidentally discharged. The buckshot entered the right side of his face and exited at the top of his head. The family buried Martin on a hillside along the trail. Ringo headed to Texas in 1869. There, he earned a deadly reputation in numerous gunfights. He later fought in the Mason County War of 1874-1876. For his actions in this feud, he spent nearly two years in jail until charges were finally dismissed. Afterward, **he settled in Loyal Valley, Texas where he did a short stint as a constable. His life as a “lawman”, however, didn’t last long as he next appeared in Cochise County Arizona in 1879. There, Ringo hooked up with the Clanton Gang, a group of outlaws commonly known as The Cowboys, around Tombstone. In December 1879, a drunk Ringo shot unarmed Louis Hancock in a Safford, Arizona saloon when Hancock refused a complimentary drink of whiskey, stating that he preferred beer. It is notable to say Hancock survived his wound. In Tombstone, Ringo had a reputation as having a bad temper. While in Cochise County, it’s believed he may have participated in robberies and killings with The Cowboys. January 17, 1882, Ringo and Doc Holliday traded threats and seemed headed for a gunfight. Both were arrested and hauled before a judge for carrying guns in town. Both were fined. Ringo was suspected by the Earp’s of taking part in the December 28, 1881, ambush of Virgil Earp, that crippled him for life, and the March 18, 1882, murder of Morgan Earp while he was shooting pool in a Tombstone saloon. Johnny Ringo was found dead on July 14, 1882 in Turkey Creek Canyon. He was killed by a single bullet wound to his right temple that exited the back of his head. There are modern day theories as to who killed Johnny Ringo. A popularized belief in the movie Tombstone is that Doc Holliday stepped in for Wyatt Earp in response to a gunfight challenge from Ringo. Other theories believe that Wyatt, himself, or, that Buckskin Frank Leslie may have killed Ringo. Pony Deal a friend, fellow gambler and member of the “Cowboys”, was convinced that the dangerous Ringo was killed by a gambler named Johnny O’Rourke (AKA Johnny-Behind-the-Duece). A coroner’s inquest officially ruled Ringo’s death a suicide. This ruling only adds more mystique to Ringo’s death as there were no spent cartridges found in his gun when the body was found. Johnny Ringo is buried a few yards from the tree where his body was found. The grave is located on a ranch southeast of Wilcox, Arizona, on private property and can only be viewed with permission.**
