Touch hole Liners. What the Hay?! I have been shooting muzzleloaders actively for about the last three years. Most of the time, I shoot my percussion gun. Every so often, I bring out the flintlock. When I shoot the flintlock, I have to deal with a slow lock time and somewhat unreliable ignition.

Meanwhile, all the old black powder wags brag that their flintlocks are just as fast as the percussion and nearly as reliable, if not more so. So why was I not seeing it with mine? Many would say that I still have a lot to learn about flintlocks and their ignition. This is true and I learned a lot Sunday.

What I learned is that most flintlocks in competition have touchhole liners. I realized before that a lot of flintlocks have them. I just didn't know why. The touchhole liner is a bushing with a conical interior. It replaces the traditional flash hole channel

which is simply a straight hole bored through the barrel perpendicular to the axis of the bore. The conical shape of the touchhole liner brings the main charge much closer to the spark, resulting in quicker ignition. The spark no longer has to travel 0.25" or more to get to the main charge. Faster ignition happens and, in some cases, it is more reliable also. This results in better accuracy in two ways. The shooter can concentrate better as he has confidence that the gun will go off every time and his accuracy will improve because the faster lock time means that follow through becomes less of a factor.

These touch hole liners are great for competition and their use is not unlike the service rifle guys tricking out their AR-15s for competition. However, you would be hard pressed to find an original American-made flintlock rifle with a touch hole liner. A

rare or expensive 18th-century gun, here or there, might have had a touch hole liner. But for the most part, it is a 20th-century enhancement to flintlock shooting. So, while we are checking people out for period dress, maybe we should also be checking to see how traditional their flintlock is with that 20th-century feature – the touchhole liner. I do know one thing. I no longer feel guilty about shooting percussion. It's certainly as traditional as touch hole liners in flintlocks, if not more.

May brings two special events to the Black Powder range. May 2 is the regular monthly woods walk while May 15 is the 2nd Annual George Wildrick Service Rifle Woods Walk. See the flyers elsewhere in this issue of the P&K or on the "coming events" page on the DSC website.

“The Wild Bunch”

By looking at this picture, one might think that these men were bankers or businessmen rather than members of one of the largest and most notorious band of outlaws in the American West known as the Wild Bunch. The Wild Bunch was led by two gunmen better known by their aliases, Butch Cassidy (Robert Leroy Parker) (picture bottom right) and Kid Curry (Harvey Logan) (picture bottom left). They were a loosely knit bunch of thieves and rustlers that preyed upon stagecoaches, small banks and especially railroads from the late 1880s to the first decade of the twentieth century. They flourished in the 1880s and '90s in Wyoming, Colorado, Utah and surrounding states and territories. The Wild Bunch pulled off the longest string of bank and train heists in American history.



In addition to Butch Cassidy and Kid Curry other prominent members of the gang included the Sundance Kid (Harry Longabaugh)-the famous friend of Butch Cassidy, **Elzy Lay**, “Tall Texan” **Kilpatrick**, **News Carver**, **Matt Warner**, Butch’s brother **Dan Parker**, “Flat Nose” **Currie** and **Harry Bass**. From 1889 through the turn of the century the Wild Bunch allegedly stole the modern-day equivalent of about \$2.5 million, before each of its members was caught or killed.

Their main Wild Bunch hideouts were **Hole-In-the-Wall**, a nearly inaccessible grassy canyon and rocky retreat located in north-central Wyoming; **Brown’s Hole (now Brown’s Park)**, a hidden valley of the Green River, near the junction of the borders of **Wyoming, Colorado and Utah**; **Robbers’ Roost**, a region of nearly impassable rugged canyons in east-central Utah, and the **Wilson W. S. Ranch**, near **Alma, New Mexico**. These hideouts had many advantages. They offered a clear view of all approaches, they were hard to find and get into and if it became necessary, they were easy to defend. Pretty much any outlaw on the run was welcome in these hideouts. Soldiers, Pinkerton detectives, and law-

men eventually captured or killed most of the Wild Bunch in the late 1890s and early 20th century. By 1903, the Wild Bunch had split up. A few, including Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid, renewed their careers in South America.

In a classic 1969 movie titled “**Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid**”, Paul Newman as Butch Cassidy and Robert Redford as the Sundance Kid depicted the famous friendship between these two Wild Bunch outlaws.

Concerning The Wild Bunch and Single Action Shooting Society. Since its inception, SASS has been owned and run by a board of directors known as the “**Wild Bunch**”. All rules for Cowboy Action Shooting were created by the Wild Bunch. Inspired by the 1969 Western film, “The Wild Bunch”, directed by Sam Peckinpah, SASS has sanctioned Wild Bunch Action Shooting.

If you haven’t tried this type of shooting as yet, you should check it out. The Cowboy Action Wild Bunch Match is one of the hottest matches going. The next DSC Cowboys Wild Bunch Match is on Sunday, May 23. Check the cowboy calendar for future 2021 Wild Bunch Match dates.

Each set of animals is shot in two banks of 5, one shot at each target. There is a time limit of 2 minutes and 30 seconds to fire 5 shots. All shooting for score is from the offhand position. No slings, shooting gloves, or shooting jackets are allowed.

REGISTRATION/FEES:

The league fee is \$45 and covers any of the rifle leagues and includes the banquet with door prizes for the member. Member guests pay \$25 each. The banquet is held Dec. 4. An associate membership is \$10. Range fees are \$6 for work hour members and \$8 for members and associate members. The non-member range fee is \$20. The non-member escorted guest fee is \$15. Range fees include a \$1 environmental fee.

LEAGUE SCORING:

League membership and a minimum of 8 scores are required to qualify for an award certificate. A competitor's highest 8 scores will be used to determine league standings. Award certificates will be given for the highest scores in the Master, AAA, AA, and B classes in both Smallbore Rifle and Smallbore Hunting Rifle. Spotters are strongly encouraged, as they can really help shooters improve their performance. Practice scores may be shot, but league members shooting for record have priority. Score cards must be turned in to the RO upon completion of the match.
