DSC Food Drive

The Detroit Sportsmen's Congress is hosting our first Community Food Drive June 16-20 to benefit the American Legion Post 351 and Utica Trinity Lutheran's Veterans' and Community Food Pantry. Collection boxes will be in the DSC Clubhouse and at the DSC Campground Wednesday through Sunday. A contactless collection will run 10 a.m. - 3 p.m. Saturday, June 19 in the DSC parking lot.

The Veterans' and Community Food Pantry was created in July 2019 when the American Legion and Trinity Lutheran combined their separate food banks into one large pantry on the church's property. It stocks food staples including canned goods, cereal, peanut butter and jelly, cake and muffin mixes and pastas like spaghetti and macaroni & cheese. The pantry also offers a special feature, frozen meat that is donated from local restaurants, catering

businesses and grocery stores.

All donations are accepted and greatly appreciated, although, they would like to concentrate on donations such as instant oatmeal and cereal boxes, canned meat like chicken and tuna, all canned fruits and vegetables especially carrots, soups – canned and boxes, rice and pastas, spaghetti sauce and stewed tomatoes, boxed baking mixes, strawberry or raspberry jelly, salad dressings, condiments, any single serve canned meal like beef stew, chicken alfredo or chili and protein drinks such as Ensure or Boost. The pantry helps lots of senior or homeless clients, so we stock the single meals and some hygiene items.

The pantry is open to anyone that needs assistance through appointment. Call 586 801-0081 for more information or to schedule an appointment.

Tom Horn (1860-1903)

**“Killing is my specialty. I look at it as a business proposition, and I think I have a corner on the market”.
These are the unsettling words of one of the West’s most infamous hired killers.**

Before Tom Horn became an assassin, he was a Western hero. He served as an Army scout, deputy sheriff and a Pinkerton Detective. As a farm boy in Missouri, he was an avid hunter and outdoorsman. He was attracted to the West in his teenage years. He learned cowboy skills and became a champion competitor in the early rodeos.

During the Apache Wars he enlisted in the U. S. Army as a mule packer or mule wrangler. He fought in combat as a scout and played a significant role in the surrender of Geronimo. Ten years later, he re-enlisted in the Army to scout for the Apache Kid and in 1898 Horn went to Cuba as a chief packer for Teddy Roosevelt’s Rough Riders. His most notorious career, however, was that of a hired gun. Horn worked for the celebrated Pinkerton Detective Agency which hired him to track down and apprehend western outlaws who were plundering Pinkerton clients such as banks and railroads that could afford to pay for private law enforcement wherever the public law enforcement system had failed them. After four years with the Pinkerton’s, Horn became bored, and in 1894 he signed on as a hired killer with the privately managed Wyoming Cattlemen’s Association. The large cattle barons had been fighting a vigilante war in Johnson County against an assorted group

of small farmers, sheep ranchers and rustlers who were resisting the cattlemen. So, Horn began to stalk human prey. The cattle barons hired Horn to use his gun handling skills to ambush and murder any man they marked as a troublemaker. Shooting from as much as 200 yards away, Horn’s victims never knew what hit them.

November 20, 1903, the notorious hired killer, Tom Horn, was hanged for supposedly murdering Willie Nickell, the 14 year-old son of a southern Wyoming sheep rancher. The assassination of the boy was blamed on Horn. Horn was undermined by corrupt local officials, and his conviction was based on a “trumped-up confession” that would not be admitted in a modern-day court of law. Horn was hanged in Cheyenne, Wyoming one day before his 43rd birthday.

The 1980 movie titled “Tom Horn” starring Steve McQueen and Linda Evans depicts the story of Tom Horn.

In many ways the 1800s in Australia resembled the American Wild West.

Following the loss of America, the British government began to send convicted felons to Australia in 1787. This continued until 1868. Escaped convicts, those that survived in the harsh landscape, began to prey on the farmers and townspeople who had settled in Australia. These escapees became known as 'bushrangers'

The Australian gold rush started in 1851 when a Californian miner found gold in New South Wales.

Ultimately, the gold ended a colony and founded a nation. People flooded into Australia hoping to make their fortunes. Many did but it also created many bushrangers who preyed on the settlers.

There are numerous stories of their exploits, but, mainly they were ruthless criminals who robbed and killed innocent people. Ned Kelly was the most famous of these bushrangers. He and his gang rode into Jerilderie, a small town in New South Wales, took over the bank and the police constable then went across the street to the hotel and invited everyone in the town to the party. As the gang ran out of money paying for the party, they went back across the street to get more from the bank. After a couple of days, they rode away. Later

they made armor out of plate steel and barricaded themselves in a hotel at Glenrowan after a failed attempt to derail a train full of police sent to capture them. In the ensuing gun fight, the hotel caught fire and Ned Kelly strode out to do battle with the police surrounding the hotel. His armor deflected their shots until one policeman with a shot gun wounded him in his unprotected legs. He was taken to hospital and patched up. As soon as he was recovered, the government tried him and hung him.

Another bushranger was Ben Hall, an honest farmer betrayed by his wife and neighbor, who reluctantly turned to crime. His gang robbed the coaches and drovers and held up hotels in the district, usually staying to party with their captives. They had numerous contacts with the police, and shootouts were common with casualties on both sides. Hall was eventually killed by a police team, which included an aboriginal tracker.

There were many more such exotic characters, most of whom were caught and hanged or shot by the police.

My grandfather started his banking career riding shotgun on the Cobb & Co Gold coach back in the 1800s.
