

22 Rimfire Rifle Woods-Walk Shoot Saturday Sept. 25, 2021

Primitive Range in Delaney Park at the Detroit Sportsmen's Congress.

This is a fun shoot for 22 rimfire (S,L and LR) rifles.

Registration: 9:45-11:30 a.m. The first safety briefing begins at 10 a.m. with the shoot commencing afterward. Firearms with non-removable magazines will be loaded at the firing line only. Removable magazines may be loaded between stations but not inserted until the shooter is at the firing line.

There are four divisions; Adult – Iron Sights, Adult – Optical, Junior – Iron Sights and Junior - Optical.

Re-Entry for another division is allowed

The junior division is for shooters 16 and under. Juniors must be accompanied by an adult.

The course of fire is five shots each on 10 hanging steel targets at various distances between 20 and 60 yards in the woods. Range Officer scoring decisions are final.

Fee: \$10 per shooter. Shooters 16 and Under: \$5. For Safety Reasons, NO 22 MAGNUM or 17 Rimfire AMMO!

The Rise of the American Cowboy

The era of the American cowboy began at the end of the Civil War in 1865. The turning point occurred in the 1890s. Somewhere around 1890, the cattle ranges became fenced in and the growth of the railroads had eliminated the need of long cattle drives. Thus the period of the "old-fashioned cowboy" came to an end, and the working ranch cowboy began to evolve.

Oh, To Be a Cowboy

The typical cowboy was aged between 17 and 28. Some research indicates they may have started as early as age 13 or 14 to start acquiring their cowhand skills. His life consisted of more than driving cattle to market. With the excitement of the spring roundup being over, the cowboy's life settled down to hard routine chores. There were all the chores of ranch work to be done, which were never ending. Working cattle was some of the hardest work. There were horses to be broken. cattle to be doctored for disease such as screwworm, stuck cattle to be pulled out of bogs created by spring rains, and to be on lookout for rustlers. After hours of boredom fence, usually riding alone, and performing other menial chores around the ranch, they longed for the adventure of the next spring roundup.

Life on the Range

Range life was harsh. The cowboy lived in his saddle for days on end, rode in blizzard and heat wave and was lucky to eat one good meal a day. The ranch bunkhouse he bed-

ded down in was often a sod hut sunk into a hillside, sometimes a log cabin, its walls covered with newspaper to keep out the winds. In summer, bunkhouse would crawl with lice and bedbugs, and snakes and rats would be attracted inside by the shade. To while away the boredom of the evenings, the cowhands would read. compose songs and poems, play practical jokes on each other and tell tall tales. The cowboy's evenings were often hedged by the petty restrictions of the ranch owner. It's said that Charles Goodnight even forbade the game of mumblety-peg on his spread. For all this the cowboy was paid between \$25 and \$50 a month. Most cowboys accumulated nothing beyond the clothes on their back and their saddles. Some cowbovs did not even own the horse they rode on.

The history of the American cowboy covered a brief, but incredible, span in history. But the true grit, strength of character, hard work, and independent nature of the cowboy still lives large today. Here, at the DSC, the spirit of the American cowboy is best exemplified by the dedication, hard work ethic and strength of character in our Cowboy Committee members. In essence, one can say that we still "Live the Dream" of the "golden days" of the American cowboy.
