



DSC Club Officer Election 2021

Five members have accepted nominations for the six available board of directors seats and one has accepted the nomination for the one board of trustees seat. Since only five candidates are running for six open seats on the board, you will be hearing from our chairman of the board, after the election, to fill the open seat. Keep an eye on the P&K and our email list for more details about how to apply for the open slot after the election.

At the Oct. 6, 2021 DSC General Membership meeting, the slate of candidates for the 2021 election were introduced. All candidates may address the membership regarding their qualifications for office at the Nov. 3, 2021 General Membership meeting. Each one will be permitted three minutes to give their best pitch. The candidates photos, qualifications and intentions for the upcoming year are also published in the P & K.

Voting Timetable

The election starts Monday, Nov. 15, 2021. All in-person voting will take place at the DSC Office. Members may vote during normal DSC office hours throughout the week. Additionally, the DSC Office will be open Saturday, Nov. 20, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Polls close Dec. 1 at 8 p.m., before the general membership meeting. You must be in the office to cast your vote prior to 8 p.m. Members may also vote by absentee ballot. A sample ballot, with the slate of candidates, is printed in the P & K and posted on the DSC website.

Voting is by official DSC ballot. Each member (or primary family member) gets one vote for trustee and five votes for directors. If you exceed these vote totals for any one office, you will void your entire ballot. This applies to both in-person and absentee voting. REMEMBER NO WRITE-IN CANDIDATES ARE PERMITTED.

2021 Absentee Ballot Procedures

1. Following the November General Membership meeting, members may request an absentee ballot be mailed to them from the DSC office. DSC takes no responsibility for any unforeseen delays by the U.S. Postal Service, either in delivering or receiving absentee ballots.
2. In the upper right hand corner of the ballot, you must legibly write your membership number.
3. Complete your selections on the ballot.
4. Place the marked ballot into an envelope and seal. Label this envelope "**ABSENTEE BALLOT**".
5. Place the sealed absentee ballot envelope, your DSC membership card and a self-addressed stamped envelope into another envelope. Address and mail it to the **DSC Office - 49800 Dequindre, Utica, MI 48317**, also mark it **Attention: Election Committee**.
6. DSC office staff will punch your membership card and place your sealed ballot into the ballot box. If your membership card is not included, the sealed absentee ballot envelope will be declared invalid and destroyed. Your card will be returned in the self-addressed stamped envelope after it has been punched. If it is not included, the card will be retained at the office for you to pick up. It is not the responsibility of the office or election committee to return your card.

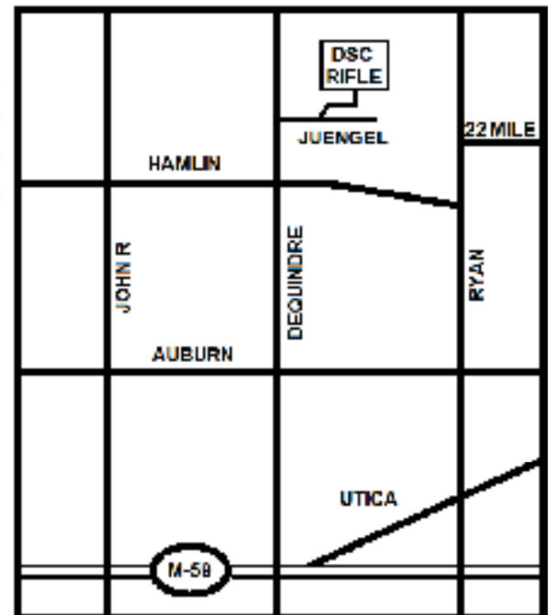
