Pistol Education

Among the many DSC traditions are the education and instructional programs covering the interests of our members and the general public. Twenty-one years ago, when Michigan became a "shall Issue" concealed pistol license state, interest in the state-required CPL training course sky rocketed. The DSC responded quickly offering the NRA certified course which has continued to evolve to what it is currently.

Today's DSC CPL/personal protection class continues to exceed the state requirement making it one of the best in Michigan. This 10.5 hour CPL/personal protection class provides instruction in:

- pistol handling and firearms safety rules (including firearms in the home)
- pistol and ammunition fundamentals and shooting techniques
- considerations and techniques for carrying concealed while in public
- 2.5 hour attorney review of Michigan's CPL and relevant firearms laws, and implications of using a pistol in a self-defense situation
- practical live fire range exercises (3 hours, shooting 170 rounds: .22 cal as well as typical self-defense ammunition)

The DSC CPL/personal protection classes are taught once a month (except July/August) over three evenings - typically a Monday & Tuesday, then again the following Monday evening. Each night consists of both classroom instruction and live-fire range exercises.

There is also a one night, three-hour CPL renewal class for those needing the required training to renew your CPL.

Also taught in conjunction with the CPL/personal protection course is the NRA basic pistol course for those who are new to pistols, or anyone who wants additional experience with certified instructors. The basic pistol class is also a combination of classroom instruction and live- fire range exercises. This basic pistol class typically precedes the CPL/personal protection class the Sunday before, and is a great lead-in (and highly recommended) to the CPL/personal protection class. Both the basic pistol, and CPL classes are open to adult DSC members as well as the public/guests.

There is also a separate NRA basic pistol course tailored specifically to junior shooters. So, what makes these DSC classes among the best, and differentiates us from many others? Consider the following:

- The DSC chief instructor, Bob Savo, has decades of experience and is both a certified NRA training counselor and a Michigan Coalition of Responsible Gun Owners master instructor (only one of five in Michigan).
- All other instructors are also NRA and/or MCRGO certified instructors, as well as certified range safety officers. There are several instructors with prior law enforcement or military experience. The combined instructor experience exceeds 150 years.
- During the three-hour range live fire each student will have their own individual certified instructor to coach them through the exercises; 1-on-1.
- The required firearms law course material is presented by experienced attorneys who specialize in firearms law.
- DSC can provide class-training ammunition at a reasonable (current market) price if needed (.22 cal, 9mm, .38 special, .45 cal).
- Great opportunity to try a wide range of pistols as the DSC, and the instructors can provide students many pistol options to experience (both revolvers and semi-automatics). Students can also bring their own pistols as well.
- Post class additional instruction can usually be arranged with one of our certified instructors if any student wishes to further their training.

If any adult DSC member, or adult family member, is interested in either of these classes, this Fall/ Winter/Spring is a great time to sign up. Note that these classes are also open to the public, so, feel free to mention them to any of your family and friends who might be interested. Arrangements can also be made for a group class, whether it be family, friends, or just ladies - all can typically be accommodated.

Even if you don't think you would carry concealed, these classes provide great training and safety knowledge for any gun owner. Costs vary by class and depend on whether you are a member and if DSC is providing the ammunition. OBJECTIVES:

The objective is to teach the basic knowledge, skills and attitude necessary for the safe and proper use of rifles. This course is designed and intended for juniors, <u>10 years</u> and up, but adults are welcome.

This course includes 12 hours of training on safety, gun parts, operation, ammunition, cleaning, storage, shooting fundamentals, rifle sports and activities. The course is mandatory for juniors to participate in the DSC Junior Rifle Program. *Open to the Public*





Black Powder

There are no scheduled events for Black Powder this month. The next events will be in February. So, without further ado, we will get to the main topic for this month, the Murphy's Formula bore cleaner. This home brew cleaner formulation has circulated on the internet for many years and was recently mentioned in the November Issue of Muzzle Blasts magazine. There are many variations, but the basic formula is one part Murphy's Oil Soap (one part isopropyl alcohol and one part 3% hydrogen peroxide.

For a little background, I would like to note that in my professional career, I have been formulating industrial and institutional cleaners for 35 years. The last 20 years, I have worked on metal cleaner for steel and aluminum for the aerospace and other industries. I mention this not to brag, but to indicate that I do have some background in metal cleaning.

Right off, I would like to mention that I have no personal experience with this particular cleaner. From the composition, I would think it is pretty good. The Murphy's Oil Soap is a good cleaner on its own. Soaps are somewhat outdated surfactant technology but are still quite effective and are particularly effective on particulate soils such as the black powder residue. The isopropyl alcohol is a good cosolvent for the MOS. It also will aid in barrel drying. Both of these ingredients are effective raw materials for a good bore cleaner.

The last ingredient, hydrogen peroxide, is the one that I have an issue with. Hydrogen peroxide is a strong oxidizing agent. It readily reacts with organic materials if they have any functional groups at all. It works great as a destainer or a bactericide. On the downside, this high reactivity gives it a very short lifetime. For this reason, the hydrogen peroxide is made up in very pure water. When the cleaner is first made up, this liberation of oxygen in the mixture causes foaming aids in lifting soils from the barrel. So far, so good.

However, if stored with alkaline organic materials such as are present in the MOS, the peroxide reacts with the organics rapidly decaying to oxygen and water. Now, this is not something you need to worry about. The peroxide level in the formula degrades an insignificant portion of the soap or IPA.

However, after a day or so, the peroxide is completely consumed. In other words, with time the peroxide contributes nothing to the cleaning. You could have just used high quality water instead. While it doesn't really aid in cleaning, you need not worry about it rusting your rifle barrel — its gone.

I think it would be interesting to make a Murphy's Formula with water replacing the hydrogen peroxide to see if it cleans as well as the original.
