There are multiple factors in determining this honor, including number of targets thrown, actual yearly increase, percentage increase, junior participants in registered skeet events and finally, the number of registered events that the club hosts.

On a regular basis DSC hosts 11 registered events and draws participants from across Michigan and Ohio and Indiana. DSC also has several members on the 2022 Michigan State Team. These include Andrew Bielman, Mike Delgado, Jerry Kott, Jerry Davis, Nick Bielman, Jeremy Salisbury and Rick Trawinski.

Finally, the Michigan Skeet Association also recognizes the association's member who have shot the most registered targets in the state. DSC's members Jerry Kott / 12,550 and Andrew Bielman / 12,150 are Michigan's highest target shooters. Think of it, 24,700 competitive targets shot between them and that doesn't include practice. Through the participation of many of the members of the DSC, our club has again received this award.

If you haven't attended one of the registered events, you should come by and shoot or just watch some of the best skeet shooters in the state participate. I promise you will enjoy it.

DSC Rifle hosted the annual Ground Hog shoot in honor of Ground Hog Day, Jan. 30. The simulated ground hogs were 2-liter pop bottles hanging from strings at the 200-yard line. Six bottles are required for each participant. This year the weather was very COLD! Despite the weather the turnout was great – 23 shooters. The top shooters were Tom Sullivan for least number of shots (8) and Victor Wyee for the least amount of time (1:01). Three black power guys shot 16oz bottles at 50 yards. In that category, the winner completed the course in 14 shots.

The next rifle special event is the Fred Wallwork Memorial Potato Shoot, March 20. In this event, we shoot at 6 potatoes hanging at 50 yards using .22 rifles. Firing is from the standing position except juniors may shoot off the benches. It is suggested that hollow point ammo be used as sometimes the hits with standard velocity solid points do not show much effect. 2022 DSC Scholarship

The Detroit Sportsmen's Congress Scholarship Fund is accepting applications for our two DSC scholarships from the children and grandchildren of voting members in good standing with a minimum of two years of DSC membership and our junior members. Each student is asked to complete an application and essay. Applicants must also include two applicant appraisal forms and an official high school/college transcript. Application packets are available at the DSC office now. **Deadline for submission is April 1, 2022.**

DSC 2022 Service Rifle Clinic & Match

The purpose of this clinic is to provide instruction and training for the new shooter in Service Rifle competition. Emphasis placed on positions, rules, competition and match operations. Clinic is open to any US citizen 14 years or older with a maximum number of 40 students. Instruction provided by certified CMP grand master instructors and NRA rifle instructors, who are also competitive rifle shooters. The DSC offers a yearly service rifle league. This will allow you to apply what you have learned and continue to improve your marksmanship.

Entry fees include all class material, match, ammunition fees and the use of a rifle. Due to range capacity and course materials, we require a non-refundable registration fee of \$40 for this clinic and match.

Deposits must be received before **20 April 2022**, entries received after this date will be placed on stand-by. Confirmations, by email unless you include a self-addressed post card with your entry.

CLINIC: **FRI. 29 April 2022** (6:30 p.m. – 9:30 p.m. approx.~ Clubhouse) **SATURDAY 24 April 2021** (9:00 a.m. – noon ~ Clubhouse)

MATCH: **SAT. 30 April 2022** (1 to 6 p.m. ~ Rifle Range) Practical exercises (using Garands and AR-15s followed by the match at 3 p.m.)
50-round approved CMP Match. MATCH IS OPEN ONLY TO THOSE STUDENTS ATTENDING THIS CLINIC

FEES: Non-member \$100, DSC member \$70 and junior 14-18 \$40. Fee includes clinic and match. Ammo is included.

TIME: Competitors **must attend** a mandatory squadding and safety meeting at approximately 3 p.m.

RIFLES: Rifles and ammo provided, M1 Garands and some AR-15s.
Students with an AR-15 or M1 Garand rifle may use them in the match provided they pass a safety inspection.

RULES: Current "CMP Service rifle" rules. Competitors are required to score targets. Target scoring will be on the frame. Eye and ear protection required for competitors and spectators on the line (available). COURSE OF FIRE: Fifty rounds plus sighters at 200-yards. Ammo included.

Sighters: 5-shots ~ 10-minutes ~ any position

Phase 3: Rapid fire standing to prone posit. ~ 10 shots ~ 70-seconds
(SR-42 — 300-yd reduced target)

Phase 1: Slow fire standing position ~ 10-shots ~ 10-minutes
(SR - 200-yd target)

Phase 4: Slow fire prone position ~ 20 shots ~ 20-minutes
(MR-52 — 600-yd reduced target)

Phase 2: Rapid fire standing to sitting position ~ 10 shots ~ 60-seconds
(SR - 200-yd target)

Notes: 3-minute prep. periods for the rapid-fire phases. For slow fire, block times will be at the discretion of the chief range officer.

Prominent Stage Lines of the Old West

Cheyenne & Black Hills Stage Line (1876-1886)

More famously called "The Deadwood Stage." This route operated between Cheyenne, Wyo. and Deadwood, S. D.

The stage was equipped as a treasure-stage to carry gold from Deadwood to the railroad. Shotgun guards, or shotgun messengers as they were known in the day, accompanied the coach on its trips. These shotgun messengers were men with a reputation as "killers." All were well-known characters who had performed deadly exploits and were known as dead-shots. These men composed the force of gunmen that defended the coach. Despite this protection, bandits, by treachery, successfully pulled off the Cold Spring Station Tragedy.

The bandits first captured Cold Spring Station by taking away the station manager and its caretakers, then hid themselves while awaiting the arrival of the Deadwood Stage. Soon the stage arrived, and the driver, not expecting any danger, drew his team up to a standstill at the stable door. A volley of gunfire killed two of the shotgun messengers and wounded the other guards making resistance impossible. The outlaws got away with \$60,000. A little while later, the stagecoach endured another ambush. A barrage of bullets killed the driver, and just as the bandits were confident of their success, a woman named Martha Canary, who later became known as Calamity Jane, who was riding on the seat with the driver,

seized the reins, applied the whip to the team, and amid the running gunfire brought the coach safely into its destination.

This remarkable stagecoach, The Deadwood Stage, which has traveled hundreds of thousands of miles on the great plains, in delivery of mail, express and passenger and army service, and thousands of miles by water and rail, on exhibition in America and Europe with Buffalo Bill Cody's Wild West Shows, ridden in by the crowned heads of Europe and viewed by thousands, became of such great historic value that it was placed in the Smithsonian Institution at Washington, D. C. for preservation. Today, the coach is at the Buffalo Bill Historical Center, an affiliate of the Smithsonian Institution, in Cody, Wyo.

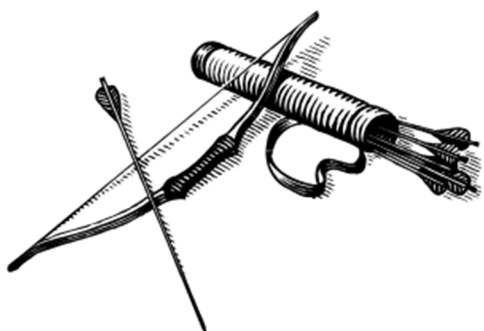

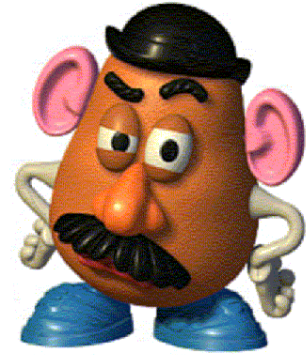
