## Prominent Stage Lines of the Old West The Overland Mail Company

As was explained in the May P & K issue, the "Jackass Mail" also known as The San Antonio and San Diego (SA&SD) Mail Line, was the first transcontinental mail service, in the history of our country, that brought mail from San Antonio, Texas to San Diego, California. The SA&SD mail service only ran twice per month and did not

cover key cities such as San Francisco. Around September 16, 1857, the Postmaster General awarded a contract for \$600,000 for six years to John Butterfield. Butterfield met the terms for building the trail and started service from San Francisco. John Butterfield, the president of this company, officially designated it **The** Overland Mail Company (OMC). Although Butterfield's Overland Mail Company did travel on some of the trails made by the SA&SD Mail Line, the OMC made significant new improvements by building new sections to shorten the trail. In Arizona, the OMC built twenty-three new stage relay stations. The SA&SD started its service on July 24, 1857 and ran until December 1858. The Overland Mail Company started its service in mid-September 1858. SA&SD and OMC services overlapped each other. SA&SD benefited by the new trail sections that OMC built for about three months. Since the OMC route had two starting points, one in St. Louis and the other in Memphis, Tennessee it was better positioned to receive mail from the northeastern and southeastern United States for

delivery to San Francisco. Because the Overland Mail route started in St. Louis, MO, it truly connected the East to the West in 1858. St. Louis was the jumping-off point for the Western Frontier. An interesting fact about Butter-field's Overland Mail Company is that **no Overland Mail Company stage on the Southern Trail was ever held up by outlaws.** It was forbidden to ship any valuables on Overland Mail Company stages. In the company's Special Instructions issued to all employees, Butterfield issued Order No. 8 stating that "No money, jewelry, bank notes, or valuables of any nature, will be allowed to be carried under any circumstances whatever."

### Rifle


