We are coming to the end of the first session of the Junior Archery Development Program outdoor archery class. There are 28 registered archers doing a great job. Some of the archers are already shooting at a 50-meter target in the wind and heat. Many of the other archers have improved dramatically and were shooting anywhere from 15 meters to 40 meters in a very short amount of time. It's great to see the improvement of shooting in the outdoor environment. With the high winds, rain, mosquitos and animals visiting, the archers have done a great job in focusing on shooting skills.

For those archers that are interested, we added the opportunity to shoot the 3-D course. The archers enjoyed the different 3-D targets at different angles, distance and elevations. This added option has given shooters the knowledge of how 3-D shooting works: how to aim depending on how you're facing the target and how to find for your arrows when you miss and have to venture into the woods.

If your interested in joining us for the second session, space is still available. The second session starts July 14. Flyers are posted in the clubhouse, or come on down the hill and grab flyer and begin shooting. We have 12 bales set up at different distances for each skill level. We are proving opportunities to shoot at different 3-D targets and we will have other fun activities to shoot. We our looking forward to seeing you on the range.

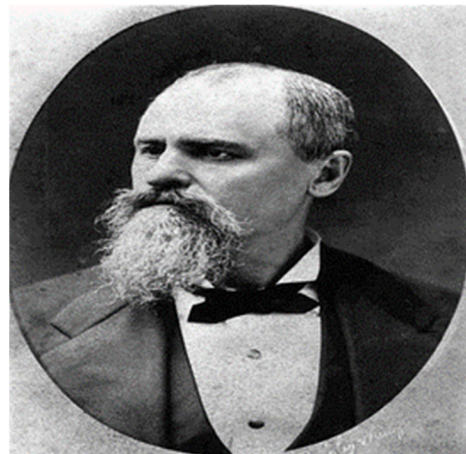
Prominent Stage Lines of the Old West: Ben Holladay “The Stagecoach King”

Benjamin Holladay (Oct. 14, 1819 – July 8, 1887)

Ben was an American transportation businessman responsible for creating the **Overland Stage to California** during the height of the 1849 **California Gold Rush**. He created a stagecoach empire and he is known, in history, as the “**Stagecoach King**.” Through his friendship with Brigham Young, the Mormon leader, Holladay established a profitable freighting contract to Salt Lake City, Utah during the peak of the Mormon War in Missouri. His transportation domain later included steamships and railroads in Oregon.

He learned the transportation business at an early age by helping his father lead wagon trains through the **Cumberland Gap**. Holladay became seriously involved in the transportation business in 1846 during the Mexican American War when he contracted with General Stephen Kearny to supply wagons and supplies to the U. S. Army.

In March 1862, he gained control of **Central Overland California and Pikes Peak Express Company** and its 1,200 miles of stage lines. Upon winning the postal contract for mail service to Salt Lake City, Utah, he established the **Overland Stage Route** along the **Overland Trail**. He then improved and expanded the trail with more “way stations,” a fleet of new **Concord Stages** and improved the routes. By 1866, the **Holladay Overland**



Mail and Express Company stretched from Atchison, Kan. to Denver Colo. to Salt Lake City, Utah. He became the sole owner of 20,000 stages and employed more than 15,000 people. Passenger revenues often totaled \$60,000 per month. The fare from Atchison, Kan. to Salt Lake City,

Utah was \$350. Over a period of five years, the U. S. Post Office paid him nearly two million dollars. The shrewd Ben Holladay was aware that the new **Transcontinental Railroad** would eliminate the need for stagecoach transportation. So, on Nov. 1, 1866, he sold the routes, equipment and contracts to **Wells Fargo and Company** for \$1.5 million cash, \$300,000 worth of Wells Fargo & Company stock, and other benefits.
