Range Officer scoring decisions are final.

Did the Cowboys of the 1800s Really Wear Vests?

In just about every western movie we watch, cowboys are wearing "vests." The question arises, did cowboys of the old west really wear vests? To take a case in point, the accompanying picture shows that members of Company F of the Texas Ranger's Frontier Battalion are wearing vests. During the 1800s, mustaches, hats, boots and vests became fashion symbols among males in the American west.

The fashion started about two hundred years earlier, in 1666 Europe, when England's King Charles II took a liking to the sleeveless tunics brought back from Persia by British travelers. He decreed that his noblemen should sport these "vests." The rage was to wear the vest under a long, formal coat. The vest was cut so it stopped at the waist and became known as the waist-coat (pronounced "west kit").



In the Old West it was appropriate for men to wear vests over their shirts. Vests were worn by impoverished cowboys, well-to-do gamblers, bad-tempered outlaws, intrepid lawmen and straitlaced bankers. They would shuck the morning coat and opt for a vest. The cowboy vest served more as a function than a tradition. It was hard to retrieve articles from trouser pockets while riding in a saddle. The vest offered pockets in which to stow a pencil and notebook so the cowboy could tally cattle. Other pockets could carry tobacco another a jackknife. More importantly, the vest offered a sleeveless layer of clothing that kept him warm and allowed his arms the freedom to swing a rope or engage in other cowboy activities.

Vests were one of the few Old West styles that Hollywood got right in its western movies.



Rifle

I though that I would use this month's article to describe the new prone league. The original name was the tactical prone league, but the scope has expanded and grown to the point that just "Prone" league works well. The original intent was to get the AR-15 shooters that we see every day at open shooting to try a league. Well, this goal was never met as most of the prone league shooters are shooters already competing in other DSC leagues. Still attendance has been good and is growing. There are no weird rules concerning guns and ammo. Any safe centerfire gun and ammo combination is good to go. The course of fire is 20 shots from the prone position using a front rest or bipod (or a sling if you so desire). The target is the 600 yd reduced to 200 yd MR-52 target that is used by service rifle. There are currently about 12-14 participants.

Last year we added a new category - You can now shoot from the bench. This is, of course separate from the prone competition but with this new category, there are few physical limitations that would prevent anyone from competing. We currently have two shooters in the bench category. This year, I was requested to add a 22 LR category for the prone league. I didn't think it would generate much interest, but it sure did. We now have 6-8 shooters working on that. It is likely that we will have more soon as some of the shooters complete their 12 CF scores and have time to try out the 22LR competition.. Shooting a 22LR rifle at 200 yards is challenging. It is analogous to shooting a centerfire rifle at 600 yards. You can't have any position errors, you need to follow through, and you need to know how to read the wind or your scores will suffer. Despite this, I have seen 22LR scores in the 190s so far — a 200 may be possible. That is excellent!

If you are interested in this league, come out and give it a try. Your best opportunity is Thursday evenings. I am there most Thursdays and would be glad to show you how it works.
