

German WWII Surrender 80th Anniversary Shoot

May 4, 2025

Germany announced their surrender May 4, 1945. The official signing of the surrender documents was May 7, in Reims, France, with the end of operations taking effect May 8, 1945.



This commemorative shoot for the end of the war is for WWII military rifles. They can be from any nation, but they have to have been used in WWII. Therefore, M1As, ARs, SKS, AKs and they like are not allowed. You may still shoot one for fun, but will not factor into the final results.

Course of fire: 20 shots prone at 200 yards and 20 shots standing at 100 yards, slow fire.

Carbines and like are 20 shots prone at 100 yards and 20 shots standing at 50 yards, slow fire.

There will be a 10 minute unlimited shot, sighting period prior to the match start at competitor's choice of distance. Sight adjustments are not allowed between stages. Service rifle equipment allowed.

Targets: SR target at 200 yards and the SR-1 target at 100 and 50 yards.

Fees: \$20 for the first gun and \$10 each for any additional guns.

This is Match #1 of a two part series. The second part is the Japan surrender shoot Aug. 17, 2025. You do not have to shoot both parts. Each match is a separate match. Both matches will be combined to find an overall champion.
