CPL Practice Resumes

CPL practice will resume on designated Sunday evenings from 5 to 7 p.m. commencing Oct. 9, 2022 for intermediate shooters and Oct. 23, 2022 for basic shooters. Practices are held in the basement range and are limited to club members who hold a Michigan CPL permit. Practices are scheduled October through April as follows:

Second Sunday of the month - Intermediate Shooters. These are persons who have been previously designated as intermediate level or who were regular attendees to last year's basic level practice sessions and were upgraded to Intermediate level at the end of last season.

Fourth Sunday of the month - Basic Shooters. These are persons who attend the Oct. 16 orientation and begin their practice session the following week. It also includes last year's basic level shooters who were not regular attendees to the practice.

Oct. 16, 2022, 5 - 7 p.m. - Novice Orientation. This is an orientation that persons who haven't attended the practice must attend prior to attending their first practice. There is no exception to this policy for any reason. Orientation is held only once a year.

The monthly black powder woods walk was held under overcast and dark weather Sept. 11. The targets were not easy to see. Nine shooters participated. This is a very nice turnout especially with shortages in black powder and percussion caps. The winner was the author who hit 13 of 15 targets. Marty Greiner finished second with 12 hits shooting his 32 cal. squirrel gun. He recently added a set trigger to this gun and that helps. He would have won for sure except for a couple of hang fire-induced misses. He said he should have changed the flint earlier. Most shooters are beginning to run very low on powder or caps but are finding that they can still shoot because their buddies can/will supply their needs to keep them shooting. While we don't know when #11 caps will become available again, the old Goex plant is scheduled to be in production in the spring. That should help alleviate the powder shortage.

The Annual Memorial Shoot is Sunday, Oct. 9. This begins with a ceremony to honor DSC BP members who have passed away. After that, there will be shooting, and hawk and knife throwing contests.

The second is the ever-popular lever gun shoot. The date for this event is Saturday, Oct. 22. You can find details on these events in flyers on the Coming Events page of the DSC website or elsewhere in this issue of the P & K.

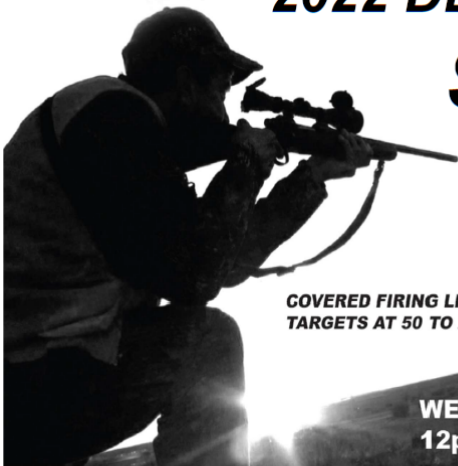

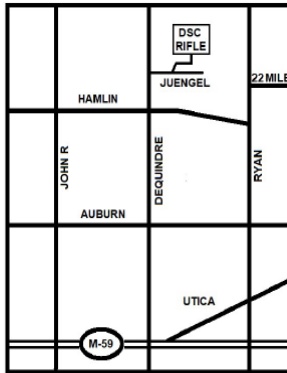

Legendary Women of the Wild West Era ETTA PLACE (Born 1878 ? - Disappeared July 31, 1909)

Among some women of the Wild West era, Etta Place's life is cloaked in mystery and legend. Could she have been a schoolteacher who left her serene life for a life of drama in the outlaw world? She was a friend of American outlaws **Robert LeRoy Parker, a.k.a. Butch Cassidy** and **Harry Alonzo Longabaugh, a.k.a. Sundance Kid**. The three were members of the outlaw gang known as **Butch Cassidy's Wild Bunch**.

Was she Butch Cassidy's girlfriend? Was she in love with the Sundance Kid or were they just friendly companions? Historical evidence seems to show that Etta was born about 1878. She became a prostitute at Fanny Porter's bordello in San Antonio, Texas. When the **Wild Bunch** came through town, Place went with them to rob banks. She wasn't with Sundance and Butch when they were killed in South America in 1909. Some believe she became a cattle rustler, but no one really knows for sure.

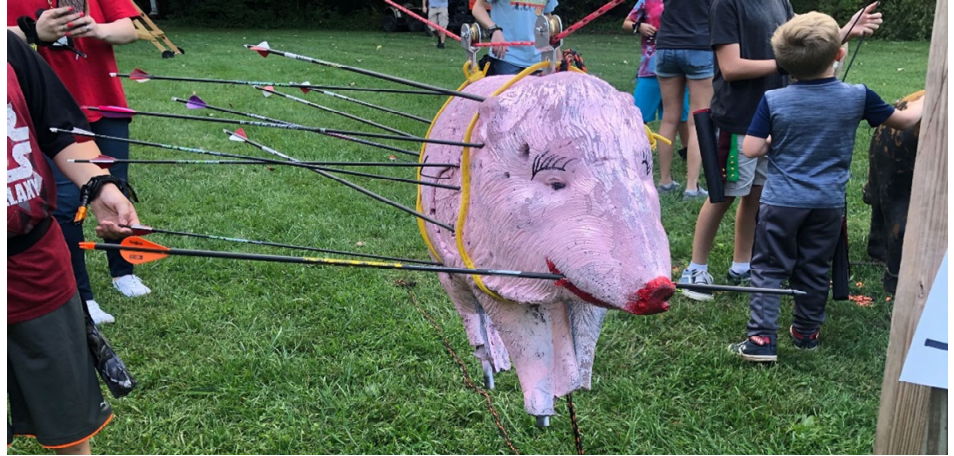
