Remember 900 Shoot (Archery)

When: Sept. 10. Shooting begins at 10 am. Check in starts at 8:30 a.m.

Class: Two classes. Compound freestyle and compound bowhunter.

Freestyle: Any type of sight can be used. Any release can be used. Rear stabilizer can not touch any part of the archer body.

Compound Bowhunter: Up to five sights pins can be used. Release aids are allowed. One anchor point allowed. Stabilizer must be less than 12" from the back of the bow. Rear stabilizer can not touch any part or the archer body. No adjustment to equipment during a round.

Cost: \$25 cash per archer, paid on the day of shoot.

Awards: First place \$100. per class. Second place \$50 per class. Third place \$25 per class

Distance: 60 yards, 50 yards, 40 yards. 5 ends of 6 arrows for each yardage at 122 cm rainbow target. Two practice ends at 60 yards only prior to competition.

Registration: Contact Shannan Lancaster at sscaster@aol.com or 586-764-2331 by Sept. 1. Please do not procrastinate. Limited spots will fill up fast.

Rules: Anyone can sign up and shoot. Please note all ages and sexes compete against each other in the freestyle or bowhunter class.

All arrows must be all the same weight, length, diameter and have the same fletching. No arrows larger than 23 allowed. (9.1mm and less)

At the 7th end we will take a 20-minute break. 8th - 15th ends shooting order will be reversed. Standard archery whistle commands will be used to signal the start and end of the shooting time. Disobeying the whistle commands will result in a zero for your score, and/or disqualification.

Scoring: For scoring, each ring from the outside is worth one additional point, except the innermost gold ring. This means that the rings are worth:

White 1 & 2 Points, Black 3 & 4 Points, Blue 5 & 6 Points, Red 7 & 8 Points & Gold 9 & 10 Points
There are some peculiarities with the innermost gold ring (called the "X" ring). "X" s are used for tie-breaking purposes. It is written on the scorecard as "X" and is counted as 10 points. If two competing archers attain the same score at the end of the tournament, the victor is decided by "X" count. If the arches have the same amount of "X"s, then 9s will be counted to break the tie. Equipment malfunction will be allowed for two ends make up. (Max. of 12 arrows)
Will have equipment inspection before shooting.

Notes: 20 archers minimum to run the tournament. Maximum of 48 archers. Estimated time to do the shoot is 2 ½ hours with the 20-minute break. Any other questions, please contact me.

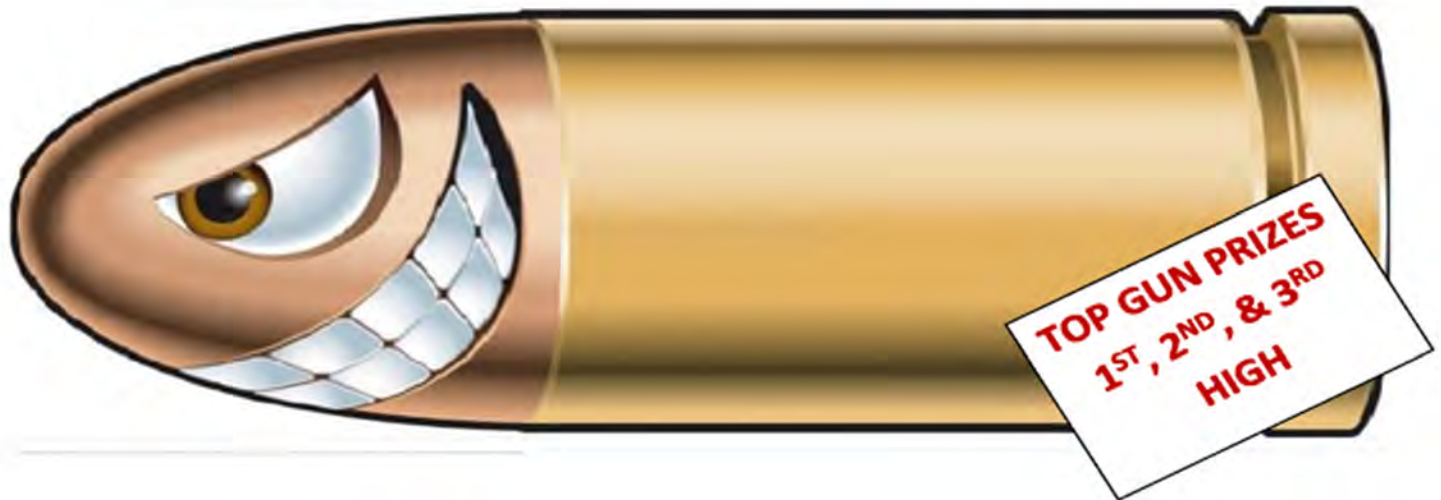

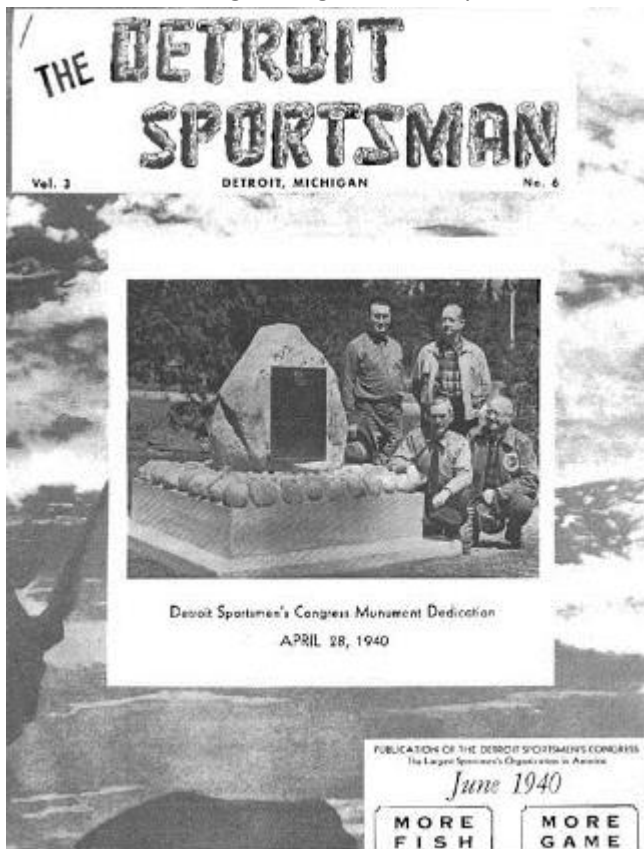

DSC Monument

The following is a reprint on the DSC Monument originally dedicated in 1940.

Sunday April 28 at the intersection of the Sturgeon River and U.S. Highway 27, better known as the Taft Memorial Highway, the Detroit Sportsmen's Congress Monument was dedicated. A beautiful clear day, with the sun shining through the silvery clouds with a



soft breeze whispering through the pines, birches and cedars, with the rippling waves of the Sturgeon River singing its way through the woodland, with impressive ceremonies the first monument dedicated to sportsmen in the United States was unveiled. A group of about one hundred and fifty people stood in silent respect. Here and there members of the Congress dressed in their brilliantly hued hunting shirts, khaki breeches; with high cut shoe packs, lent color to the occasion.

As Lloyd Egan President of the Congress told of the inspiration instilled in all the members of the congress at the time of the death of the late Russell W. Schmidt, of his unselfish effort for conservation and how the seed that was planted at that time resulted in the building of the memorial, many a big rough hand was noticed being pushed across the eye to remove the tear that was running down most of their faces. One felt that he was far removed from the cares and worries of worldly things.

Kurtz sounded Taps and everyone stood in silent attention till the last silvery note had floated off on the breeze into the deep forest.

The oldest birth date on the plaque is 1865 with two members born that year, Jack Miner and Grant (Dad) Dugan.
