# Blackpowder ~ Cap and Ball Revolvers

Back in about 1975, my dad bought a Numich Arms Minuteman muzzleloading rifle kit. Shooting that gun got me hooked on muzzleloading and blackpowder. In 1980, I bought my own muzzleloader kit. It was an 1851 Colt navy replica sold by Lyman but probably made by Armi San Marco in Italy. I had a lot of fun putting that gun together, even if my finishing skills left a lot to be desired. These kits were not the highest quality. The cylinder timing was awful. The cylinder stop dragged on the cylinder and left a furrow all the way around the circumference. These were the days before Google and Youtube to find a solution. However, you could get some help from the local gun store. They suggested I replace some of the action parts. This is when I learned that original Colt parts and reproduction guns do not usually go together. I also learned that there was a lot to fitting these parts correctly. In any case, the gun actually shot pretty well despite its limitations. However, I sold it in the early 1980s.

Around 1995, I got the bug again and purchased an Uberti 1858 Navy. This was copy of the Remington revolver that competed with the Colt revolvers. The usual caliber for the 1858 Remington is .44 but since I still had the equipment for the old Lyman Colt replica, I bought it in 36 caliber (i.e. Navy).

The 1858 Remington revolvers are nice in that they have a backstrap like modern revolvers. This makes them stronger than the Colt designs (at least until the 1873 model). It was one big heavy revolver but well made and shot very well. My only real complaint against the design was that the room for cap installation was tight and made capping somewhat tedious. Then interests turned to old military rifles (remember Turk Mausers for \$50 and Turk Ammo for \$0.10 a round?) and highpower shooting. The Remington Navy just sat in a drawer for many years. I eventually sold that one too. You know, between the two, I like the Colt design better. It just seems to balance naturally in the hand.

Recently, I traded for an 1851 Colt Navy replica made by Uberti. It is the London model, so called because the originals were made under license in England. They were marked "LONDON" on the barrel. The only significant change from the US model is a steel backstrap instead of brass. That makes it a little stronger but is not quite as pretty as the brass trim to my mind. I am having fun relearning these revolvers and their quirks. Here are some things I learned /relearned about shooting cap and ball:

## Blackpowder cont.

1. You may have some difficulties capping your replica revolver. In the 1980s, I think they used #10 Caps. I haven't seen #10s in stores in several years. Most modern replicas now use #11 caps. The issue is that there are variations in the cap dimensions between manufactures as well as in the nipples of the different revolver makes. This makes a difference. The caps must fit snugly so they don't fall off but not so tight that they don't seat properly. Now, when you could get two or three kinds of caps you would likely find a brand that works well. But today, you are likely only to find one brand of caps, if you can find any at all. So if your revolver doesn't like that brand, you are basically SOL. By the way, expect to pay close to twice the price you do for rifle primers, about \$15 per 100. If you run into this problem you may want to invest in a second set of nipples. They may work better than the originals.
2. The modern replicas I have examined are of much better quality than those made in the 1970s and 80s. The fit and finish is much better. There is also a lot more variety. The most popular caliber seems to be .44 followed by .36. But you will also see some .32 caliber pocket pistols out there too. Have fun.
3. As hard as it is for moderns to believe, the original cap and ball revolvers shot conical bullets more than round balls. This round ball fad for the revolvers started with the replicas. I don't know why. Even today, conical shaped bullets for these revolvers are a specialty item. You usually have to cast your own. The reason I mention this is that this little difference could cause a lot of trouble. You load round balls with the lever and plunger mechanism that you find under the barrel. Most modern replicas have flat plungers that accommodate modern shooters using round balls. When you press down on the lever the flat surface guides the round ball in with no issues. My Uberti came with a plunger cut deeply for conical bullets. The deep cut is perfect for the pointed conicals but when you use it on round balls the plunger cuts into and holds onto the lead ball. As you lift the lever up after seating, the round ball comes out with the plunger. I solved the issue by switch-

ing to the round ball plunger which is a replacement plunger from Pietta. You could modify the one you have but the Pietta replacement works and is inexpensive.

4. Revolvers disassemble easy for cleaning. For example, Colt models come apart by simply moving the wedge pin out of the way. You then have four easier-to-clean units to work with: the barrel, cylinder, frame and nipples. The frame is the easiest since it does not require further disassembly and can be cleaned with any good gun cleaning product. The nipples should be removed from the cylinder. Invest in an ultrasonic cleaner. You can put the cylinder, nipples and barrel in the ultrasonic with hot soapy water and run for about 3 minutes. You will be amazed how clean the parts get and at the time you saved trying to get that stuff out with toothbrushes, etc. Continue cleaning and oiling from then on like any other muzzleloader.

There is no way I can cover all there is to know about shooting cap and ball revolvers in a short article like this. But note that there are many resources on-line that cover the basics. For most, these guns are an interesting footnote from history. But maybe for you they could be a new venue for your shooting hobby.
