Blackpowder

This month, the Black Powder committee holds their first special shoot of the season. It is the Annual George Wil drick Memorial Service Rifle Woods Walk. The black powder committee supports these special events in order to show off the woods walk range to shooters that are unfamiliar with it. It is situated down in Delaney Park. You follow Juengel Road east until you get to the gravel pit. Turn left through the yellow gates and follow the road down. You will pass Cowboy Town on your right and then come to Sporting Clays. Keep going. At the end of the sporting clays parking lot you will find the entrance to the Black Powder Woods Walk range. Welcome.

Some may be asking – “What is a Woods Walk Range? At DSC, this range is a series of targets, the backstop for which is the side of the adjacent hill. These targets are hanging steel objects such as plates, rectangles, woodchuck silhouettes, etc. They are located in the woods on the side of the hill. The number as well as size and distance of the targets varies depending on the match. However, the farthest target is no more than about 60 yards distant.. All shooting is done from the standing position. It is called a Woods Walk because you walk from one firing position to the next as opposed to a rifle match where you remain in the same position for the whole match.

As a competitor, you will be in a group of 3-5 shooters and accompanied by a Black Powder Range Officer. The range officer is in charge of safety and scoring. He will call your name when it is your turn to shoot. Note that your gun must be unloaded at all times until it is your turn at the firing point. You can load your magazines behind the firing point but can’t insert it in the gun until you are at the firing point. You can load your magazine to the appropriate number of shots for that target. Because this is the service rifle woods walk, we will be shooting eight times at each target (There will be 7 targets for a total of 56 shots). This number was chosen to favor the M1 Garands – no contortions to load partial clips. When you are done shooting, you will show the RO that the rifle action is open and the gun is empty.

This Service Rifle Woods Walk sees all kinds of guns. Mausers, Enfields, an SKS or two as well as the usual Springfields, Garands and M1 Carbines are all likely to be seen. Note that steel core bullets damage our targets and are not allowed. We use a magnet to test. There will be separate divisions for iron and optical sights and there is a division for junior shooters as well.

This event is scheduled for Saturday., May 18. Registration is from 10 a.m. - Noon. The fee is \$10 and \$9 for reentry. If we get rained out, the makeup date is May 25. There is a flyer on the coming events page of the DSC website and elsewhere in this issue of the P&K.

2024 DSC Smallbore Silhouette League



LEAGUE TYPE:

NRA Smallbore Rifle Silhouette: Silhouette Rifle and Hunting Rifle categories – see <https://competitions.nra.org/media/7825/nra-silhouette-rifle-rulebook.pdf> for official rules.

DATES:

Every Tuesday and Saturday, May 4 through Sept. 28, 2024 excluding holiday weekends, including the Saturday after Independence Day.

LOCATION:

DSC 200 yard Rifle Range, 49800 Dequindre, Utica, Mich. 48317

STARTING TIMES:

Tuesdays: Shooting begins at 5 p.m.

Saturdays: Sight-in begins at 4:30 p.m., shooting begins at 5 p.m.

COURSE OF FIRE:

The NRA Smallbore Rifle course is 40 shots total, ten at each animal. Which consists of:

- 10 chickens at 40 meters
- 10 pigs at 60 meters
- 10 turkeys at 77 meters
- 10 rams at 100 meters

Each set of animals is shot in two banks of 5, one shot at each target. There is a time limit of 2 minutes and 30 seconds to fire 5 shots. All shooting for score is from the offhand position. No slings, shooting gloves, or shooting jackets are allowed. Only target velocity lead bullet ammo is allowed to prevent target damage.

REGISTRATION/FEE:

The Silhouette league fee is \$50. The league fee covers the league banquet with door prizes for the member. The rifle banquet is Dec. 7. An associate membership is \$50. Range fees are \$6 for work hour members, \$8 for members, and \$14 for associate members. The non-member range fee is \$20. The fee for a guest of a member is \$15. If a Member or an Associate member wishes to participate in the high power, sporting rifle or smallbore leagues, no additional league or membership fees will be charged. All range fees include a \$1 environmental fee.

LEAGUE SCORING:

League Membership and a minimum of 8 scores are required to qualify for an award certificate. A competitor's highest 8 scores will be used to determine league standings. Award certificates will be given to the league members that score the highest in the Master, AAA, AA, and B classes in both smallbore rifle and smallbore hunting rifle. Spotters are strongly encouraged, as they can really help shooters improve their performance. Practice scores may be shot, but league members shooting for record have priority. All record scorecards must be turned in to the R.O. upon completion of the match.

NOTE: This is a lot more fun and relaxed than the formal rules make it sound. Come and try it!

Hello from Sporting Clays, always a lot going on, so will start with upcoming events.

The Winter League is ongoing and will wrap up in May. The banquet will be held Saturday, June 8 at the DSC Clubhouse. Cocktails begin at 5 p.m. with dinner served promptly at 5:45 p.m. Please plan on attending as it is always a great time.

Regarding League's, note that we will once again be hosting a Summer League that begins in July and runs thru November. As per the Winter League, 100 targets are shot each month. Cost is \$55 for Members and \$75 for non-members. As always, a banquet will be held at the conclusion of the League. The League is a great way to participate in some friendly competition and all skill levels are present from new shooters to advanced. Saturday, May 11 the '125 Shoot' will be held. The course of fire for this event is 50 targets shot at Sporting Clays, 25 targets at Sporting Clays 5 Stand and 25 targets each of Skeet and Trap. These will be shot at the Shotgun field adjacent to Dequindre. Cost is \$20 if registering prior to May 11 and \$25 the day of event. Entry fee includes lunch and door prizes. As a reminder, Sporting Clays will be closed on Saturday, May 18 for the Scholastic Clay Target Shooting program.

The month of March saw 488 rounds being shot! This equates to a minimum of 24,375 targets being throw, assuming 50 bird rounds. As many rounds were 100 bird rounds, the target count is actually quite a bit higher. So, for the year to date 1217 rounds have been shot with a minimum of 60,825 targets being throw. Think about that for a moment.... It is a great credit to DSC, the Sporting Clays staff and the volunteers who provide much valued assistance.

If you have never shot Sporting Clays, come out and give it a try. We are fortunate to have such a great course that is both fun and challenging!!

DETROIT SPORTSMEN'S CONGRESS GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING Apr. 3, 2024

President B. Saylor: Opened the meeting at 7 p.m. by recognizing the past presidents and life members present. DSC's newest junior NRA distinguished rifle expert was then recognized by Mr. Barber & Salo for her accomplishment in only 1 and ½ years – congratulations Aviana Bradford! President Saylor then reported:

Dequindre road project is progressing – drain behind office is now done – be patient.

Rifle range lanes #1 - #5 are closed (rubber removed) to facilitate backstop evaluation – plan being finalized with wood prototype under construction - then will be reviewed by safety/rifle committees for input. Objective is a 50 year life span for the new design.

With spring approaching, there are lots of opportunities for work hours – especially painting projects. Pistol range drainage issue is under evaluation.

Camera security system installation is now complete with a few adjustments remaining – but working quite well as they clearly picked up 2 coyotes on the road to sporting clays .

1st Vice President: (J. Estes) Reported next life member meeting is June 9 with banquet to follow (pre-register with office). Mr. Estes then emphasized the many grounds & buildings projects for 2024 that will start soon (among many others for this year): trap houses repaired, cowboy buildings painted/repared, clubhouse and range building deck painting, Juengel Road fence & posts etc. Noted was the upcoming (October) Michigan state “wild bunch” cowboy shoot at DSC. As always volunteer help is needed – especially painting.

2nd. Vice President: (J. Rhodes) Reported no new incidents, and thanked all RO's for their efforts. Mr. Rhodes re-stated that RO's are always needed, and RO trainees are most welcome at any range. Emphasized that with spring cleanup activities starting, anyone using equipment needs to: know how to use it safely, insure it is operating properly (with all of its safety features functioning), and wear appropriate personal safety gear. Ask for help/equipment training as needed, and notify the office of equipment issues

Chairman's Report: (J. Lupi) BOD met on Mar. 18 – 2 business items discussed:

Motion to pay \$360 deposit on 50 tickets to hold the date of Aug. 16 for a Jimmy John's field baseball event / fundraiser.

Motion was approved after BOD discussion modifying it to make it contingent on clarification that DSC is not obligated to pay the remaining balance (of \$1,440) if not all 50 tickets are sold.

(carryover) Motion to approve Education committee SOP changes regarding firearm and archery equipment sign-out and control procedures - approved.

Operations Manager: (B. Palmer) Recognized RO's supporting LEO rentals (especially Pete Taucher) who RO'd recently on his 92 birthday! Ms. Palmer mentioned the flyer for the Apr. 19 clubhouse karaoke event & dinner would be published shortly – includes rib dinner, fires and coleslaw – pre-order is required .

Member of the Month: (B. Saylor) Mr. Tom Murphy

New Members: Three new members introduced themselves: Mr. Brian Crabtree, Ben Leach, Russ Bradford – welcome!

Committee Reports:

Archery: Indoor spot league ended Mar. 21 – winner was Tony Monterosso. Our JOAD team did a fantastic job at the indoor JOAD tournaments: Brooklyn Gentry was 11 out of 28 in her division; Dakota Gentry took 6 place in her division; Nathan Wolowiec took 1st place in flight #3 of his division. The kids and moms also enjoyed the tournament activities at Churchill Downs (and the dads won with a lot of bourbon tasting). Starting April 29 through June 24 spring 3D outdoor league (2-person team format for 8 weeks – start at 6pm for 15 targets). Apr. 24 starts an 8 week target league to get ready for the outdoor tournaments.

Black Powder: Still hosts Monday night open shooting in basement range 6 – 8 p.m. through April. Mini rendezvous every Tuesday, and specialty shoots start again in May watch P&K and website for info.

Camping: Mr. Saylor reported that campground opened Apr. 1 with seasonal lot prep underway.

Clubhouse: Mr. Klobuchar highlighted the recent successful St Patrick's day party. Next is April 19 karaoke night (with rib dinner), followed May 10 with Cinco de Mayo party (taco bar). In June we'll take the clubhouse to the campground for a cookout – all members are encouraged check out all that the campground has to offer .

Life Member: (see Mr. Estes report above)

Membership & Show, Conservation: New member orientation is Apr. 21 at 1 p.m. in clubhouse – conservation topics: Mr. Duey presented DSC with 2 large copies of aerial photos of the campground: one posted in clubhouse, the other for the campground office. Ludington was 2023 most used state campground. State is making efforts to improve our campgrounds. There is a webinar for storm/emergency debris removal (how to safely, where etc.). DNR is considering allowing E bikes (some classes) on bike trails. Outdoor turkey hunt Oct. 11 for women is planned. 2025 DNR academy taking applications through May 23. More hemlock disease has been found – DNR has info on how to prep and protect against it. Great lakes water levels are back to normal range after trending high now for several years. There is a forestry legacy program allowing privately owned land to be donated to the state. DNR has a trial bovine TB program in Alpena county on how to inoculate animals through feed. Avian flu is apparently jumping species (to cows), with 2 reported transmissions to humans as well. Clinton river is undergoing a stocking program this spring. DNR recommends delaying oak tree trimming to mid-July (help control beetles). Reminder there are new fishing regulations effective Apr. 1. Ducks unlimited donation campaign reported \$3 billion towards the \$4 billion goal. Bears are coming out of hibernation now, so be aware and cautious – get bird feeders removed/emptied. State natural resources council has recommended closing the coyote season for the summer (was Apr. – July).

Education: Mr. Crockatt reported that the April pistol and CPL classes are scheduled for next week. Also mentioned were upcoming classes: Apr. 26 & 27 service rifle clinic and match, May 11 NRA RSO class, May 18 AR-15 basic rifle class (info on all of these classes is on the website and in the April P&K).

Promotion & Photography: No report.

Pistol: April is last month for indoor basement range open shooting, and the indoor leagues also finish in April, then transition to outdoors. April 28 is 1st steel match – which will be preceded by an outdoor pistol range cleanup work bee. Mr. Surratt mentioned DSC participation in the SASP (Scholastic Action Shooting Program) is being investigated and could get Midway foundation support.

P&K: Reminder to get articles/pictures in by the 15 every month, and that pdf files do not work.

Rifle: The Easter egg rimfire shoot held Mar. 30 had 16 participants, with winners for best egg Pat Smith, fewest shots Walt K., fastest time Gary Dawson and Junior Colton Dechambeau. Marine Corps fun shoot is Apr. 20 (5 shots @ 200yds), followed by service rifle clinic and match Apr. 26 & 27. The AR-15 basic rifle class will be held May 18. Sporter league practices will be on Apr. 7 & 28. May 1 starts service rifle leagues. Next rifle committee meeting is Apr. 4. Mr. Saylor reported that the second golf cart is being repaired.

Skeet & Trap: March madness shoot was successfully completed. Clark Brown open shoot Apr. 19 – 21 (lunch included Sat. & Sun.) – see insert in April P&K, contact Rick Trawinski for info. One gun Minis this year start on Apr. 10 (12 ga.), then followed May 22 (20 ga.), June 19 (28 ga.), July 24 (.410) and Aug. 14 with doubles (100 targets per event, no shoot offs). Champion and class winners determined by long run – and a season champion awarded prize money (1st, 2nd, 3rd) - must shoot all 5 events to be eligible. Cost \$40 per 100 targets. See April P&K or Rick Trawinski for info. Our 800 skeet league has started in March shooting 100 registered rounds per month through October. Read the Michigan Skeet Assoc. newsletter for info where Rick Trawinski (Assoc. President) has written about skeet and individual accomplishments. Junior shotgun is getting ready for the sponsored North Macomb Eagles Fun shoot, then our S.E. conference shoot, then state Skeet 7 Trap shoot, followed by the nationals in Ohio. Juniors recently added a 5 shooter trap team, all 6th graders.

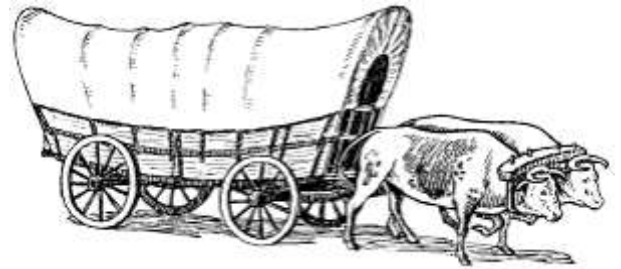

What is a "Prairie Schooner?"

The **prairie schooner** was a 19th century covered wagon used by emigrants traveling to the American west. The name **prairie schooner** was derived from the wagon's white canvas cover which gave it the appearance, from a distance, of the sailing ship known as a "schooner."

For the westbound pioneers who had a 2000 mile journey from Missouri to Oregon, few items were more important than the wagons that carried them across the vast wilderness. The vehicle had to be light enough to be pulled by oxen or mules, also durable enough to haul 2500 pounds without breaking down. To meet these requirements, most wagons were made of hardwoods like maple, hickory and oak with iron used to reinforce parts that took the most beating.



The three main components of the prairie schooner were (1) the wagon bed; (2) the undercarriage and (3) the cloth cover. The bed was rectangular and typically measured 4 feet wide by 10 to 12 feet long and included a "box" to hold tools. The undercarriage included the wheels, the axle assemblies and supports necessary for the bed and a "bucket" filled with grease for the wheels. The cover made of canvas or cotton was held in place by a frame of hickory bows and tied to the sides of the bed. It could be closed by drawstrings for privacy or protection from the elements.

Stocking up to complete the 2000 mile trip, a family of four required 600 pounds of flour, 400 pounds of bacon, 100 pounds of sugar, 60 pounds of coffee and 200 pounds of lard.

MCRGO AR-15 RIFLE BASICS CLASS

Have an AR-15 rifle, or interested in learning more about this popular modern sporting rifle? The Detroit Sportsmen's Congress will be conducting the MCRGO 1-day rifle basics class taught using the AR-15 rifle. It is intended for gunowners new to (or interested in) the AR-15 platform, or those who may be looking to enhance their basic rifle skills and knowledge. The class will be taught by DSC rifle instructors dual certified by MCRGO and the NRA. The class starts in the morning with classroom instruction, then moves to the rifle range for afternoon live fire exercises (where the student will receive 1 on 1 coaching from a DSC certified instructor).

CLASS OBJECTIVES:

- Review the history, design and key parts and components of the AR-15.
- Review how to disassemble/re-assemble and clean and lubricate the AR-15.
- Review ammunition availability and compatibility for the AR-15.
- Review the fundamentals of rifle shooting and marksmanship which apply to all rifles.
- Understand rifle safety, handling, and storage which applies to all rifles.
- Understand rifle sight in and zero, including off-set, which applies to all rifles.
- Conduct live-fire range shooting exercises with an AR-15, including range safety procedures.

WHAT TO BRING: your AR-15, 2 magazines, 80 rounds of ammunition and eye & ear protection. If you need an AR-15 and/or ammunition let DSC know. All triggers must meet 4# limit. No binary or set triggers, no bump stocks. SBRs/AR pistols, or other modifications from a typical "mil-spec rifle" cannot be used for this class. **Your AR-15 should be sighted in at 50 yds prior to the class.**
