Beginning with our new trap squad, made up of four sixth graders, Holden Southwood, Enze Tong, Danial Krasnov and Drew South, who won silver medals in their very first competition at the North Macomb Sportsmen's Club fun shoot. They followed that up by taking bronze medals at the SCTP Southeast Conference Trap shoot held at Michigan Trap Association fields in Mason Mich.

Not to be outdone our SCTP Skeet Team also scored medals at the North Macomb fun shoot. In the Intermediate Division Kyle Neely, Colton Calvin and Dylan Alexander took gold medals with Holden Southwood, Enze Tong and Tong Tong taking silver medals. The Senior Division squad of Matt Shepan, Dakota Gentry and Keegan Wettstein won gold medals with Matt Shepan taking High Gun honors.

Next up for our athletes will be the SCTP Southeast Con-

ference Skeet and Sporting Clays competition May 18 here at DSC followed by the SCTP State shoot at TMA in June and the SCTP Nationals in July at the Cardinal Center in Marengo, Ohio.

The DSC hosted its first 5-gun registered event of the year April 19-21, the Clark Brown Open. Mother Nature didn't cooperate very well, but we made do, and everyone seemed to have a good time.

The weekend kicked off with a doubles event Friday and the top 3 represented DSC very well. Champion was Rob Broadfoot from Canada, with former DSC junior Austen Fischer runner-up and in her first registered doubles event, junior Sydney Wells placed third.

Saturday brought out the 12- and 20-Gauge events. The champion was Andrew Bielman with a perfect 100x100 with Austen Fischer runner-up and Dan Panczyk 3^{rd} . The 20 Gauge was won by Rob Broadfoot, with Andrew Bielman 2^{nd} and Dan Panczyk 3^{rd} .

Sunday was another carbon copy of the previous 2 with wind and cooler temperatures. The 28 Gauge produced some better scores as Rob Broadfoot along with Dan Panczyk posted 99s where Rob won the shoot off for champion, giving Dan the runner-up spot. Third place was occupied by Rick Trawinski with a 98. The .410 results were not too bad for the conditions, where Je Desano was champion, Andrew Bielman, runner-up and Mike Delgado 3rd.

The final placings of the weekend were the High Over All results. This is where you combine all 4 gauges, no doubles, to see the overall winner. The high gun went to Andrew Bielman, runner-up was Dan Panczyk and 3rd was Rob Broadfoot.

The DSC wants to thank everyone for participating and hopes that you will return for the Mid-Summer Open, July 5-7. If you have never seen a registered skeet event, poke your head in. Maybe, you don't know what you are missing.

DSC History

History has a way of repeating itself, such was the events leading up to our newly formed Slingshot Committee. In April of 1961, a group of men from the Multi-Lakes Conservation Associates came to the DSC and put on a demonstration in the art of slingshooting then in May 1961 the DSC had a new Slingshot Committee

How long it was active, we do not know, they started in the barn and later moved to the clubhouse. We also know they gave demonstrations in area schools and at the Sports-A-Rama picnics, so they must have been pretty good.

In 1986 we again were entertained by the men and women from Multi-Lakes and again we formed a Slingshot Committee. A range was built across the rear of the clubhouse and plans called for league shooting Sunday nights with Thursday nights open for practice. The league was set to run 14 weeks during the winter months followed by a banquet.

Rifle

Summer is the busy time for the rifle range. The rifle leagues are in full swing and there is open shooting every Saturday and Sunday.

There are two Civilian Marksmanship Program Garand/ Springfield/Modern Military Matches coming this summer (June 2 and July 14). These are new. Previously, the DSC would host a match for Garands and another for Springfields, and maybe another for Modern Military rifles. However, the course of fire was pretty much the same for the different matches. The CMP recognized this and created the GSMM matches so that all these rifles could shoot in the same Eligible rifles include M1 Garands, 1903 and 03A3 Springfields and also vintage foreign military rifles such as Lee -Enfields or Mausers. The Modern Military category covers modern semiautomatic military rifles. There are two classes. Class A covers M-16/AR-15 type rifles. I think the most relevant requirement here is that the rifle must weigh less than 7.5 pounds. This is a big change to high power shooters who are used to using very heavy barrels and adding extra weights in the handguard and buttstock. Class B covers pretty much all the foreign military semiautomatics, of which, the AK-47 or SKS are typical examples. No matter the category or class, this match is for metallic sights and not optics. Hence the SR (service rifle) target with its big scoring rings is used exclusively. While some modifications are allowed, the intent of this match is to have a competition with rifles that are close to being military "as-issued" and not highly tricked out rifles such as you might find at a regular high power competition.

The GSMM course of fire is the same for all rifle categories. The range for all stages is 200 yards. There is a 5 minute period for 5 slow fire sighters from any position. The first course of fire for score is 10 rounds slow fire from the prone position in a time limit of 10 minutes. After that, there is a 10-round rapid fire string from the prone position in a time limit of 80 seconds. And the final course of fire is 10 rounds slow fire from the standing position in 10 minutes. If you score well enough, you can earn a CMP achievement pin (see Table below). Hello all from the Detroit Sportsmen's Congress Sporting Clays! The Winter League wrapped up the end of May. As always, the league was well attended and closely contested. The Summer League begins in July and runs through November. Course of fire remains the same; 100 targets are required to be shot each month. If you have never participated in one of the leagues, please consider it as it is a lot of fun. Contact Al McGee at the Sporting Clays building for more details.

The DSC '125 Shoot' is Saturday, June 22 with a 10 a.m. start. This event consists of 125 total targets being shot; 50 sporting clays, 25 at Sporting Clays 5-Stand, 25 skeet targets and 25 trap. Note that the skeet and trap targets are shot at Skeet & Trap. Cost is only \$20 plus normal range fees. Come on out and shoot this event! If any members know any nonmembers who may be interested, please let them know; the event is open to all.

April was very busy indeed. A total 560 rounds were shot. This comprises a minimum of 28,000 targets being thrown, assuming the rounds were all 50-bird rounds. However, many of the rounds were 100-bird rounds, pushing the total to more than 30,000. This in itself is impressive, but what is equally impressive is the level of reliability of the clay machines at DSC.

I have shot sporting clays at many ranges around Michigan and am convinced our course is certainly amongst the best as far as layout and also reliability of the machines.

Sporting Clays will be closed July 4 for the holiday. Also, our summer hours begin June 1. They will be our normal opening time of 10 a.m. Wednesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday. Closing time Wednesday and Thursday is 5 p.m. and 3:30 p.m. on the weekend.

Cowboy Vests

In just about every western movie we watch, cowboys are wearing "vests." The question arises, did cowboys of the old west really wear vests? To take a case in point, the accompanying picture shows that members of Company F of the Texas Ranger's Frontier Battalion are wearing vests. During the 1800s, mustaches, hats, boots and vests became fashion symbols among males in the American west.



The fashion started about two hundred years earlier, in 1666 Europe, when England's King Charles II took a liking to the sleeveless tunics brought back from Persia by British travelers. He decreed that his noblemen should sport these "vests." The rage was to wear the vest under a long, formal coat. The vest was cut so it stopped at the waist and became known as the waistcoat (pronounced "west kit").

In the Old West, it was appropriate for men to wear vests over their shirts. Vests were worn by impoverished cowboys, well-to-do gamblers, bad-tempered outlaws, intrepid lawmen and straitlaced bankers. They would shuck the morning coat and opt for a vest. The cowboy vest served more as a function than a tradition. It was hard to retrieve articles from trouser pockets while riding in a saddle. The vest offered pockets in which to stow a pencil and notebook so the cowboy could tally cattle. Other pockets could carry tobacco, another a jackknife. More importantly, the vest offered a sleeveless layer of clothing that kept him warm and allowed his arms the freedom to swing a rope or engage in other cowboy activities.

Vests were one of the few Old West styles that Hollywood got right in its western movies.

DETROIT SPORTSMEN'S CONGRESS GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING May 1, 2024

President B. Saylor: Opened the meeting at 7 p.m. by recognizing the past presidents and life members present. President Saylor then reported:

Dequindre road project is progressing – pipe going in with 2 crews now working.

Storm week prior caused notable damage to signs, pistol range, skeet stands, 100yd rifle range bases, and fencing – repairs started.

Basement range door repaired.

Emphasized that help is always needed – fix what you can and report other issues .

1st Vice President: (J. Estes) Reported next life member meeting is June 9 with banquet (pre-register with office). There are 36 painting projects as well as other grounds & buildings projects (Juengel fence etc.) for 2024 that need volunteer help. Trimmers with power heads are available for sign-out (9 days max). Suggested a work bee to cut berm trees (a state mandate). Cowboy is open with May 5, Wild Bunch Match, followed May 19 with Cowboy Match (May 18 will be match setup). May 26 will be 50 yard range practice. Cowboy is open Saturdays 10 a.m.— 2 p.m., and Wednesdays 6 p.m. to dusk.

2nd. Vice President: (J. Rhodes) Reported 2 new incidents, 1 being an improperly loaded blackpowder rifle. Strongly emphasized the requirement for proper safety glasses & gear – including hats as most ranges are a shot fall area (reinforced by President Saylor). Ticks heavy this year so wear appropriate clothing and bug spray – DSC is looking into range treatments (archery sprayed already per President Saylor). Ranges are still soft, so keep vehicles on designated paths (off the ranges). Suggested we all take the need for project help back to committees for better awareness.

Secretary's Report: (T. Crockatt) April 3, general membership minutes in the May P&K, and also posted behind the bar.

Treasurer's Report: (R. Savo) the March financial report was reviewed, the highlights are:

Mar: income = \$143,499; expenses = \$60,473; for a net gain = \$83,026

YTD: income = \$460,855; expenses = \$236,691; for a net gain = \$224,164

Thanked everyone for a great first quarter and reinforced that committee generated income is key.

Mentioned that biggest 2024 project is backstop repairs and no new loans are currently needed.

Trustee: (T. Murphy) No trustee report. Air pistol/rifle league banquet held last Thursday, league results were: Stan Surrat pistol, Corey Salo rifle (irons), Gary Dawson rifle (optics). Pro shop selling well with more than \$250 for juniors so far. New items coming soon.

Trustee: (E. Silarski) No report. **Trustee**: (C. Salo) Not present.

Chairman's Report: (J. Lupi) BOD met April 22, motions discussed:

Motion to purchase 2 tank less waters heaters for campground bathhouse was approved (not to exceed \$2300) Motion to purchase 2 electric lift gates with gooseneck key pads for the campground entrance was approved – not to exceed \$29,000.

Motion to purchase replacement USPSA steel targets and associated equipment was returned to committee.

Motion to approve "Veterans Returning Home" nonprofit organization's use of the DSC logo on their website and flyer was approved. (BOD prior approval was given for them to place a collection bin at DSC)

Motion to appoint Mr. Bob Savo as DSC's official media spokesperson was approved.

Operations Manager: (B. Palmer) Thanked everyone who participated in the rib dinner karaoke night – served 60 dinners. May 10 will be Cinco De Mayo taco bar from 5-8 p.m. with all the fixings for \$13. Mr. Pierce thanked Ms. Palmer and Studer for tonight's dinner.

Member of the Month: (B. Saylor) Mr. Jim Bauer. New Members: Mr. Dave Bryant introduced himself.

Committee Reports:

Archery: Summer leagues have all started.

Black Powder: Now shooting outdoors Monday nights at 200 yard rifle range – others welcome. Thursdays shooting .22s on 50 yard pistol range. Woods walk this Sunday, then service rifle shoot May 18.

Camping: Official opening day was May 1 with water now turned on. Memorial Day weekend will be open ceremony honoring our veterans with breakfast served.

Clubhouse: Mr. Klobuchar highlighted the very successful (& fun) karaoke night – thanks to all. Next May 10 is Cinco de Mayo party with taco bar. In June it's take the clubhouse to the campground for games (cornhole, horseshoes, and axe throwing - maybe?) and a cookout: bring dish to pass and your own entre to cook on the grill.

Life Member: (see Mr. Estes report above)

Conservation topics:

Saugatuck Brewing Co. has partnered with DNR where each case sold (May – Oct.) generates a \$1 donation during rainbow trout season. DNR started their trout and steelhead stocking program. Upcoming DNR meetings are on their website. Stink bug invasive species is here – best way to dispose of them is to drop in soapy water (crushing them stinks and attracts others) – they are also attracted to fruit trees. DNR bovine TB test area comments are due May 10. New research and data is available for CWD. Avian flu is showing up in commercial flocks prompting new restrictions. DNR weekly invasive species notice focused on need to decontaminate ORVs before leaving the site. Upcoming is a Ducks Unlimited (Lapeer chapter) women's night out as well as workshops planned. There are still licenses for the tail end of turkey season. Take note of the 2024 changes to fishing and hunting regulations. Coyote hunting has been shut down from Apr. 15 – July 15 by the state natural resources council. Upcoming is a class for juniors interested in becoming a DNR conservation officer.

Education: May CPL classes are scheduled for next week. Also mentioned were upcoming classes: May 11 NRA RSO class, May 18 AR-15 basic rifle class (info on all of these classes is on the website and in the April P&K). Committee is creating a list of all certified instructors for all disciplines.

Rifle: Held range work bee Apr. 20, followed by service rifle clinic and match last weekend. May 18 is AR-15 basic rifle class. Open shooting is now Saturday & Sunday 11 a.m. – 4 p.m. All the leagues have started - check the calendar for specific days and times for each league. The range grass will be cut Sunday after 4pm.




