Rifle

I have been a DSC member for almost 20 years. I joined to shoot in the rifle leagues – specifically the high power/service rifle league. Over time my interests both changed and broadened. First there was the smallbore silhouette league and then sporting rifle. I started the prone league to try to attract new shooters. It didn't work. Most if not all the prone league shooters were/are already shooting in other leagues. A few years ago, I also started shooting black powder on their monthly muzzleloader woods walks.

The more I look at it, the more I see that this is the old way. Potential new members don't seem all that interested in league shooting. They are not interested in the time commitment that league shooting takes. They come out to shoot just for fun. They don't have or don't want to commit the time to join leagues. Ok, fine. Maybe there is another way to get them interested in joining the club.

This is why I think the special shoots that both the rifle and black powder committees put on during the year are so important. These events are the perfect showcase for potential new members to try out the DSC ranges using a variety of equipment.

Black powder, sponsors five special shoots each year. There is one for service rifles, 22 LR pistols, centerfire pistols, 22 LR rifles and lever action rifles. Basically, it is one special shoot per month from May through Oct. except for July. Any one of these special shoots generally attracts more shooters than several muzzle loading events combined. More importantly, they seem to attract a lot of non-members. The last special woods walk was the lever action shoot. We had about 35 entries and a good 10-15 of these were non-members. It's a great venue for showcasing both the range and the club.

2025 DSC WINTER INDOOR SILHOUETTE AIR GUN FUN LEAGUE

January through April

This is league you have been waiting for. Get out once a week and shoot some air guns with friends. This is a 16-week league for both air rifle and air pistol. Instead of the traditional steel targets, we will be shooting paper targets. If the league becomes successful we may transition to steel targets.

Air rifle will be shot at 30 yards. Air pistol will be shot at 18 yards. All targets are sized for stated distance. All shooting is done from the standing position. There will be white or black targets to use, whichever the shooter prefers.

If you don't have an air rifle you may be able to borrow one from another competitor. It never hurts to ask. Just don't beat them with their gun, especially if you borrow mine.

Location: Dean Burnett Indoor Archery Range.

Time: Tuesdays, 7 to 9 p.m. First night Jan. 7, last night to record a score April 22. Banquet May 1.


Equipment: Any air gun of either .177 or .22 caliber is allowed. Sights can be iron or scope. There is no limit on magnification. Red dots are allowed. Pellets only, no BB's. No shooting jackets other than a shotgun vest and no slings allowed.

Course of Fire: Pistol, the course of fire is 10 shots per animal, 4 animals per target, 40 shots per target. Rifle the course of fire is 5 shots per animal, with two of each animal. The animals are chickens, pigs, turkeys and rams. Scores are strictly hit or miss, so 40 is top score on a target. Any shot touching the target line will be scored a hit. 25 minutes per target. Four relays an evening with target change.

Divisions: We have for divisions, two for rifle and two for pistol. Rifle optical and iron sight. Pistol, optical and iron sight.

Fees: League \$15, \$25 for nonmembers for first division. Additional divisions at \$5 each. Range fees are the normal rifle / pistol fees. The league fees will go to prizes and a simple end of season "banquet" (pizza, sandwiches or something similar).

Competition: Competitors must have ten scores submitted in their division to be eligible to win a prize. There is no limit to the number of scores that can be submitted. Winners will be determined by their 10 highest scores. There must be at least two competitors per division to win an award. You must beat someone.

Rules: As is this a fun league the rules are fairly lax. Basically shoot what you have. If you are interested in the official rules, here is the link: https://competitions.nra.org/media/8911/2023-silhouette-rifle-rules.pdf The rules covers all forms of silhouette shooting not just air gun.



Iwo Jima Flag Raising 80th Anniversary Memorial Shoot

23 Feb. 2025 10 a.m. to Noon DSC Rifle Range



Come out and commemorate the Iwo Jima Flag Raising 80th Anniversary

Feb. 23, 1945, Joe Rosenthal took the iconic photo of the second flag raising on Mount Suribachi, four days after the initial landings. June 2016, a Detroiter by the name of Private First Class Harold Schultz was identified as a flag raiser, replacing Navy Corpsman, Pharmacist's Mate Second Class John Bradley, who had been misidentified for 72 years.

This is a precision rimfire shoot, 21 shots total at 50 yards. One shot at each of the three circles in the number 80. There are seven, 80s of different sizes on the target. Scoring: 5 points if it entirely in the circle, 2 points if the border is broken and zero for misses.

Scope and bench shooting suggested. Front sandbag only, no rear rests.

Fees: Adults \$10, Juniors \$5. Fee includes one target, additional targets are \$2 each. The prize pool is \$1 from each entry fee and the \$2 additional target fee.

NRA BASIC RIFLE COURSE YOUTH ONLY

LOCATION:

DETROIT SPORTSMEN'S CONGRESS, 49800 Dequindre Rd., Utica, MI 48317. Office: 586-739-3500 (8 a.m. – 4 p.m.) **Classroom**: DSC Clubhouse (N.E. corner of the parking lot). **Range**: basement of the shotgun building.

OBJECTIVES:

The objective is to teach the basic knowledge, skills and attitude necessary for the safe and proper use of rifles. Course is designed and intended for juniors, 10 to 17 years. A separate adult class is also offered. The course is two days and includes approximately 12-hours of training on safety, gun parts, operation, ammunition, cleaning, storage, shooting fundamentals, rifle sports, activities and participate in live-fire (.22 and air rifle) range exercises. All instruction is under the direction and supervision of NRA certified instructors.

Course is mandatory for juniors to participate in the DSC junior rifle program.
