## Rifle

March is the month for reloading. The weather is still awful so you might as well get ready for the upcoming shooting season. The DSC even offers a metallic cartridge reloading class March 15. For information on this class, see the "CPL and Educational Classes" page of the www.dscweb.org website or the ad in this issue of the P & K.

I covered a lot of reloading information in the P&K throughout the previous months. One topic I did not cover is making reduced loads for full-power rifle cartridges. There are a couple of reasons for making reduced loads. The first is that you want a reduced recoil load to aid in rifle practice for juniors, women or because of injuries. Another reason to use a light load is so that you don't stress an old rifle just to punch holes in paper at 100 yards. Sometimes, you might want a reduced load because you are trying to save powder or you can't find the powder you want so you need a different load. Whatever the reasons, here are three methods for making light or reduced recoil loads.

The first is by the Hodgdon Powder Company. Go to their website (www.hodgdonpowder.com) to find an article entitled "H4895 Reduced Rifle Loads". The gist of the article is "the 60% rule" - for any rifle cartridge that lists H4895 powder (there are a lot of them), multiply the maximum load by 60% for your particular caliber and bullet. This is your new starting load. For example, if the maximum listed load for your 30.06 with a 168-grain BTHP bullet is 47.5 grains then multiply this number by 0.6 to get 28.5 grains – your starting load. You can adjust the load up from there to achieve your desired velocity and accuracy. I have used this method and have found that you can find additional sweet spots for accuracy that are below the published minimum load. Specifically, I found a great load for the 03A3 at 41.5 grains which is below the published minimum of 43 grains.

The second method was popularized by Ed Harris who was

a writer for American Rifleman and other gun magazines. He called it "The Load." An article describing this method can be found at <u>www.hensleygibbs.com</u> ("The Load" is 13 grains of Red Dot"). That's it, there is no load workup here. You use 13 grains of Red Dot Powder. This reduced load is generally for the 30.06, 303 British, 8 mm Mauser and the like. Velocities are in the 1500-1600 range. I have never tried "The Load" load but I know people who have and they like it.



Finally, there are reduced loads described in the Speer Reloading Manual - Rifle and Pistol, Number 13, 1998. These reduced loads are found in the notes for many of the service rifle cartridges and some others. The specified powders were SR 4759 or IMR 4198 and minimum and maximum

loads were described. A few years ago, I was having a hard time getting 4895 but I had plenty of the IMR 4198 from reloading 223. I tested the Speer reduced loads and found the pour formulas and they produced decent results in 30.06, 8mm Mauser and 7.7 Jap cartridges. I believe these Speer reduced loads were optimized for safety and not accuracy. However, I found them to be perfectly adequate for 50- and 100-yards shooting. They work, there wasn't much recoil and they were relatively inexpensive.

Of all three methods, I think the H4895 is best and will produce the best results.

## DSC 2025 Service Rifle Clinic & Match

The purpose of this clinic is to provide instruction and training for the new shooter in Service Rifle competition. Emphasis placed on positions, rules, competition and match operations. Clinic is open to any US citizen 14 years or older with a maximum number of 40 students. Instruction provided by certified CMP garand master instructors and NRA rifle instructors, who are also competitive rifle shooters. The DSC offers a yearly service rifle league. This will allow you to apply what you have learned and continue to improve your marksmanship.

Entry fees include all class material, match, ammunition fees and the use of a rifle. Due to range capacity and course materials, we require a non-refundable registration fee of \$40 for this clinic and match.

Deposits must be received before April 25, 2025, entries received after this date will be placed on stand-by. Confirmations, by email unless you include a self-addressed post card with your entry.

CLINIC: Thur. May 1, 2025 (6:30 p.m. – 9:30 p.m. approx.~ Clubhouse) Sat. May 3, 2025 (9 a.m. – noon ~ Clubhouse)

MATCH: <u>Sat. May 3, 2025</u> (1 to 6 p.m. ~.Rifle Range) Practical exercises (using Garands and AR-15s followed by the match at 3 p.m.) 50-round approved CMP Match. MATCH IS OPEN ONLY TO THOSE STUDENTS ATTENDING THIS CLINIC

FEES: Non-member \$100, DSC member \$70 and junior 14-18 \$40. Fee includes clinic and match. Ammo is included.

TIME: Competitors must attend a mandatory squadding and safety meeting at approximately 3 p.m.

**RIFLES:** Rifles and ammo provided, M1 Garands and some AR-15s. Students with an AR-15 or M1 Garand rifle may use them in the match provided they pass a safety inspection.

**RULES:** Current "CMP Service rifle" rules. Competitors are required to score targets. Target scoring will be on the frame. Eye and ear protection required for competitors and spectators on the line (available). For a free copy of the CMP Highpower Rifle Competition Rules in pdf format: <u>https://thecmp.org/competitions/cmp-competitions-rulebooks/</u>

COURSE OF FIRE: Fifty rounds plus sighters at 200-yards. Ammo included.

<u>Sighters:</u> 5-shots ~ 10-minutes ~ any position <u>Phase 3:</u> Rapid fire standing to prone posit. ~ 10 shots ~ 70-seconds (SR-42 — 300-yd reduced target)

<u>Phase 1:</u> Slow fire standing position ~ 10-shots ~ 10-minutes <u>Phase 4:</u> Slow fire prone position ~ 20 shots ~ 20-minutes (SR - 200-yd target) (MR-52 — 600-yd reduced target)

<u>Phase 2:</u> Rapid fire standing to sitting position ~ 10 shots ~ 60-seconds (SR - 200-yd target)

**Notes:** 3-minute prep. periods for the rapid-fire phases. For slow fire, block times will be at the discretion of the chief range officer.



## The TV (Small Screen) Westerns

America fell in love with TV Westerns. I am certain some of us "baby boomers" remember the old B Westerns from years long past. For example, TV stories like Hopalong Cassidy, The Lone Ranger, The Cisco Kid and Gene Autry. *Hopalong Cassidy* starring William Boyd was the very first Western TV series. It appeared on NBC in June 1949 and was an instant success. A few months later *The Lone Ranger* starring Clayton Moore and Jay Silverheels as Tonto (The Lone Ranger's trusted companion)



aired on television through 1957. The 1950's were big years for Small Screen Westerns, and lunch-buckets. Some of us remember the lunch buckets. You still may have one lurking in your collection of memorabilia. In 1951 *The Roy Rogers Show* appeared on television and another lunch-bucket idol was born. *The Life and Legend of Wyatt Earp* premiered in 1955 with actor Hugh O'Brien playing the fabled lawman. It was also in 1955 that actor James Arness pinned on a badge as U. S. Marshall Matt Dillon in *Gunsmoke*, a series that ran on television until 1975. Also coming out in 1955 was *Cheyenne* starring a 6-foot-6-inch actor named Clint Walker a frontier scout who roamed from town to town helping people in need. *Cheyenne* ran through 1962. In 1957, another popular series *Have Gun-Will Travel* starred Richard Boone as a do-good gunfighter named Paladin-"a knight without armor in a savage land" as the theme song went. *Wagon Train*, was introduced in 1957. This was drama about settlers on the Oregon Trail starring veteran actor Ward Bond. Roughly a year later Chuck Connors performed in the TV series *The Rifleman*, a story about a single father who used a customized Winchester Model 1892.44-

40 carbine to protect his son and his New Mexico town. TV Westerns like *Rawhide, Wagon Train* and *The Rifleman* managed to provide a lot of action while telling classic tales that give emphasis to values of peace, honesty and decency. The Big Screen Movie Westerns allowed filmmakers to explore thorny issues of American history, from social justice to economic inequality. John Ford's classic film *The Searchers,* starring John Wayne confronted racial hatred and Anthony Mann's *Winchester 73* revealed the dark nature of violence and retribution. Westerns were, in a sense, modern morality plays where heroes who were strong, dependable, clearheaded and decent fought their adversaries with integrity and righteousness.






