Rifle

There are four special rifle events coming up in the next few weeks.

The first is the annual Rifle Range Work Bee will be held April 12 from 9 a.m. to noon. This is the annual range preparation work bee. We will clean out and organize the range building and basically do whatever is necessary to get the range ready for the upcoming summer season and leagues. We will also work on servicing the High-Power league targets. This includes cleaning out and organizing the 200-yard target container. If you need work hours, this is a great opportunity for light work.

The next event is the annual Easter Egg Shoot to be held Saturday, April 19. Bring six decorated hard-boiled eggs and you get a chance to shoot at them at 200 yards. Shooting is from the prone position. There are three prize categories; the least time to shoot all 6 eggs, least number of rounds fired, and maybe best of all - best decorated eggs. Every year, this last category becomes more competitive as participants show their creativity in egg decoration. It's quite a feat to hit a chicken egg at 200 yards. This challenge makes it a lot of fun for contestants and spectators alike. Registration begins at 9 a.m., the decoration judging begins at 9:30, and the shooting event begins at 10 a.m. Hopefully, the price of eggs will not scare you away this year.

Later the same day is the 250th Anniversary Patriots Day Memorial Shoot at 1 p.m. This is the actual anniversary of the battles of Lexington and Concord. This is a 20-shot rimfire standing shoot. Targets are symbols of the British Monarchy. As usual, you can shoot more than one target.

Finally, Sunday, May 4, the DSC is commemorating Victoryin-Europe (VE) day with a special shoot. This shoot is for World War II-type rifles. The course of fire for rifles is 20 shots prone at 200 yards on the SR target and 20 shots standing at 100 yards on the SR-1 target. Carbines will shoot prone and standing at 100 yards. The shoot runs from noon till 2pm. This is the first of two shoots based on the end of the war. The second is in August. Combined results from both shoots will reveal one overall winner.

Learn how to be a safe hunter and earn your certificate. ONLINE REGISTRATION OPENS MARCH 15 Class taught by state certified hunter education instructors. Class is mandatory to purchase a Michigan hunting license for those born on or after Jan. 1, 1960.

The <u>FIELD DAY CLASS</u> is for students who have completed the ONLINE HUNTER EDUCATION COURSE <u>OR</u> completed all_review questions in the "Today's Hunter" booklet. At check-in, the online course certificate (paper or phone picture) must be presented <u>OR</u> the completed review questions are turned in.

Saturday - Lecture, demonstrations, hunting regulations. Sunday - Test review, test, firearm handling, shotgun and rifle shooting plus compass training.

Registration is online at the Michigan DNR website. **NOT** at the Detroit Sportsmen's Congress. Register at: https://michigan.storefront.kalkomey.com/em/programs or use QR code above and search by class type (traditional or field), date and for the Detroit Sportsmen's Congress class. Register for one class only.

You can view the **TRADITIONAL CLASS** and **FIELD DAY CLASS** details on March 1 with registration opening March 15. If the class is full, it will be removed from view on the web site. Student cancellations will reopen the class and restore viewing and registration options. So check back often.



THE SILENT MOVIE AND GOLDEN AGE OF RADIO WESTERN STORIES







Western movies were immensely popular during the Silent-Film Era (1894-1927). Until 1903, silent films had been onereel lasting ten to twelve minutes. The earliest known silent movie western story is the British short story *Kidnapping by the Indians* made in Blackburn, England in 1899. In 1901 Edwin S. Porter, a former projectionist and exhibitor, had taken **charge of the motion picture projection at Thomas Edison's** company. He is recognized for making longer films that tell a story. In The United States, the earliest work of the silent movie era was *The Great Train Robbery ((1903)*. This work is attributed to launching the movies as a commercial establishment medium of entertainment. The *Great Train Robbery* is noted for its rapid shifts of location, including action on a moving train.

Welcome The Golden Age of Radio Westerns: During the 1930s 1940s and 1950s, you could find some of the most popular radio westerns of all time. To name a few, The Lone Ranger, Cisco Kid, Wild Bill Hickok, Fort Laramie, Roy Rogers, Gunsmoke and many others. Before television, radio provided entertainment by presenting radio plays and programs of westerns, mystery, intrigue and comedy.

Many of these radio plays later became television shows. For example, before airing on television, the iconic Gunsmoke series ran on radio for nine years from April 26, 1952, to June 11, 1961.

The first of 2,956 episodes of The Lone Ranger premiered on radio Jan. 30, 1933, on WXYZ radio in Detroit, Mich. and later the Mutual Broadcasting System radio network and then on NBC's Blue Network which later became ABC. ABC broadcasted the shows' last new episode Sept. 3, 1954.

DSC 2025 Service Rifle Clinic & Match

The purpose of this clinic is to provide instruction and training for the new shooter in Service Rifle competition. Emphasis placed on positions, rules, competition and match operations. Clinic is open to any US citizen 14 years or older with a maximum number of 40 students. Instruction provided by certified CMP garand master instructors and NRA rifle instructors, who are also competitive rifle shooters. The DSC offers a yearly service rifle league. This will allow you to apply what you have learned and continue to improve your marksmanship. Entry fees include all class material, match, ammunition fees and the use of a rifle. Due to range capacity and course materials, we require

Entry fees include all class material, match, ammunition fees and the use of a rifle. Due to range capacity and course materials, we require a non-refundable registration fee of \$40 for this clinic and match.

Deposits must be received before April 25, 2025, entries received after this date will be placed on stand-by. Confirmations, by email unless you include a self-addressed post card with your entry.

CLINIC: Thur., May 1, 2025 (6:30 p.m. – 9:30 p.m. approx.~ Clubhouse) Sat., May 3, 2025 (9 a.m. – noon ~ Clubhouse)

MATCH: <u>Sat. May 3, 2025</u> (1 to 6 p.m. ~.Rifle Range) Practical exercises (using Garands and AR-15s followed by the match at 3 p.m.) 50-round approved CMP Match. MATCH IS OPEN ONLY TO THOSE STUDENTS ATTENDING THIS CLINIC

FEES: Non-member \$100, DSC member \$70 and junior 14-18 \$40. Fee includes clinic and match. Ammo is included.

TIME: Competitors must attend a mandatory squadding and safety meeting at approximately 3 p.m.

RIFLES: Rifles and ammo provided, M1 Garands and some AR-15s. Students with an AR-15 or M1 Garand rifle may use them in the match provided they pass a safety inspection.

RULES: Current "CMP Service rifle" rules. Competitors are required to score targets. Target scoring will be on the frame. Eye and ear protection required for competitors and spectators on the line (available). For a free copy of the CMP Highpower Rifle Competition Rules in pdf format: <u>https://thecmp.org/competitions/cmp-competitions-rulebooks/</u>

COURSE OF FIRE: Fifty rounds plus sighters at 200-yards. Ammo included.

<u>Sighters:</u> 5-shots ~ 10-minutes ~ any position <u>Phase 3:</u> Rapid fire standing to prone posit. ~ 10 shots ~ 70-seconds (SR-42 — 300-yd reduced target)

<u>Phase 1:</u> Slow fire standing position ~ 10-shots ~ 10-minutes <u>Phase 4:</u> Slow fire prone position ~ 20 shots ~ 20-minutes (SR - 200-yd target) (MR-52 — 600-yd reduced target)

<u>Phase 2:</u> Rapid fire standing to sitting position ~ 10 shots ~ 60-seconds (SR - 200-yd target)

Notes: 3-minute prep. periods for the rapid-fire phases. For slow fire, block times will be at the discretion of the chief range officer.

NRA Smallbore Rifle Silhouette: Silhouette Rifle and Hunting Rifle categories see <u>https://competitions.nra.org/media/7825/nra-silhouette-rifle-rulebook.pdf</u> for official rules.

DATES:

Every Tuesday and Saturday, 5/03/25 through 9/30/25, excluding Holidays.

LOCATION:

DSC 200-yard Rifle Range, 49800 Dequindre, Utica, MI

STARTING TIMES:

Tuesdays: Shooting begins at 5 p.m. Saturdays: 4:30 p.m. sight-in begins. Shooting begins at 5 p.m.

COURSE OF FIRE:

The NRA Smallbore Rifle course consists of: 10 chickens at 40 meters 10 pigs at 60 meters 10 turkeys at 77 meters 10 rams at 100 meters Each set of animals is shot in two banks of 5, one shot at each target. There is a time limit of 2 minutes and 30 seconds to fire 5 shots. All shooting for score is from the offhand position. No slings, shooting gloves, or shooting jackets are allowed.

REGISTRATION/FEES:

The Silhouette league fee is \$50. The league fee covers the league banquet with door prizes for the member. The banquet is normally held the first Saturday in December. An Associate Membership is \$50. Range Fees are \$6 for Work Hour Members, \$8 for Members, and \$14 for Associate Members. The non-member range fee is \$20. If a Member or an Associate Member wishes to participate in the High Power, Sporting Rifle or Small Bore leagues, no additional league or membership fees will be charged.

LEAGUE SCORING:

League Membership and a minimum of 8 scores are required to qualify for an Award Certificate. A competitor's highest 8 scores will be used to determine league standings. Award Certificates will be given to the League Members that score the highest in the Master, AAA, AA, and B classes in both Smallbore Rifle and Smallbore Hunting Rifle. Spotters are strongly encouraged, as they can really help shooters improve their performance. Practice scores may be shot, but league members shooting for record have priority. All record scorecards must be turned in to the R.O. upon completion of the match.



MCRGO AR-15 RIFLE BASICS CLASS

Have an AR-15 rifle, or interested in learning more about this popular modern sporting rifle? The Detroit Sportsmen's Congress will be conducting the MCRGO 1-day rifle basics class taught using the AR-15 rifle. It is intended for gunowners new to (or interested in) the AR-15 platform, or those who may be looking to enhance their basic rifle skills and knowledge. The class will be taught by DSC rifle instructors dual certified by MCRGO and the NRA. The class starts in the morning with classroom instruction, then moves to the rifle range for afternoon live fire exercises (where the student will receive 1 on 1 coaching from a DSC certified instructor).

CLASS OBJECTIVES:

Review the history, design and key parts and components of the AR-15.

Review how to disassemble/re-assemble and clean and lubricate the AR-15.

Review ammunition availability and compatibility for the AR-15.

Battles of Lexington and Concord 250th Anniv. Patriots Day Memorial Shoot

April 19, 2025 1 p.m. DSC Rifle Range

The night of April 18/19, 1775, 700 British troops left Boston crossing the Charles River to Cambridge to march on Lexington and Concord to confiscate colonial military supplies (guns, powder and canon). The colonials were forewarned and Paul Revere, William Dawes set out to alert Lexington and Concord. Both sides did not envision a battle. The colonists his the supplies and they thought the British would search, find nothing and return to Boston.

The Battle of Lexington was a minor skirmish. The militia was



assembled on the common with a show of force not expecting a battle. A shot of unknown origin rang out and the battle was on. After the smoke cleared eight colonist were dead.

The British continued their march to Concord. Forces again met at North Bridge. As the colonists attempted to advance over the bridge another shot of unknown origin rang out. The battle was on and colonists chased the British back, routing the enemy and securing a victory.

Remember we were taking up arms against our government. Treason is another word for it.

This is a rimfire fun shoot, 20 shots total at 50 yards. Twenty shots at symbols of the British Monarchy. Standing shooting only, if shooting for a prize. Bench shooting allowed but does not qualify for prize money. Scope recommended.

Fees: Adults \$10, Juniors \$5. Fee includes one target, additional targets are \$2 each. The prize pool is \$1 from each entry fee and the \$2 additional target fee.
