Camp Perry National Matches

Beginning in July and running through early August, the Civilian Marksmanship Program runs the National Matches for Rifle and Pistol competition at Camp Perry, Ohio.

This is one of the biggest if not the biggest competitive shooting event in the US and it attracts shooters from across the country. The number of different shooting events is too vast to list here but if you are interested, see <https://thecmp.org/cmp-national-matches/>.

This year, the National Matches were well attended by DSC riflemen. By my count, there were 12, shooting anything from 22 rimfires, to AR rifles, to old US Services rifles such as the 1903 Springfield or M1 Garand.

Many of these events now use electronic targets. This has eliminated tedious pit duty, pulling targets. I experienced these for the first time this year and was favorably impressed. It speeds up the matches so you can shoot more in one day, and scoring has been simplified such that the verifier has an easy job confirming the shooters score.

Scanning the results, I have found a couple of outstanding scores for DSC shooters. First, is Rick Nowicke, he finished 12th out of 280 in the National Vintage Military Match shooting his US M1917 rifle. Mike Lucas finished 5th out of 155 in the National Roosevelt Commemorative Match. I believe that Mike was shooting a 1903 Springfield. Mike also

earned the GCA/CMP Master Marksman Award. This award is similar to the old NRA Distinguished Rifleman Award but with M1 Garands.

Dear Fellow Pistol Range Officers,

For a variety of legitimate reasons, many of our range officers are no longer available to work on the ranges and provide the services we have offered for many years. Unfortunately, we are reaching a critical point in staffing the ranges and have been forced to close open shooting venues on a number of occasions recently.

While it's disappointing for members to find the range closed when they come out to shoot, we are also losing revenue from non-members. With other options available, non-members have little reason to come back to the range if it may or may not be open.

Because of our current situation, we'd like to invite all of our ROs to come back and join us on the range. You will be greeted with open arms. If you haven't signed up in a while, come on back. If you only RO for specific venues, try coming for open shooting and meet some new people. If your RO card has expired, we are more than willing to work with you to get up to date. Currently, the pistol range is open Friday, Saturday and Sunday from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m., which means we need (ideally) 2 ROs per day and 6 per weekend. If a few more people are willing to step up, it shouldn't be a great imposition on anyone and your service would be greatly appreciated.

Finally, we're aware that some former range officers are no longer able to volunteer due to health, time or other legitimate reasons. If that is the case, we ask that you return your keys to the DSC Office so they can be used by other ROs.

Thanks for taking the time to read this. If you have any questions, please call or email any member of the Pistol Committee and we will do our best to provide an answer.

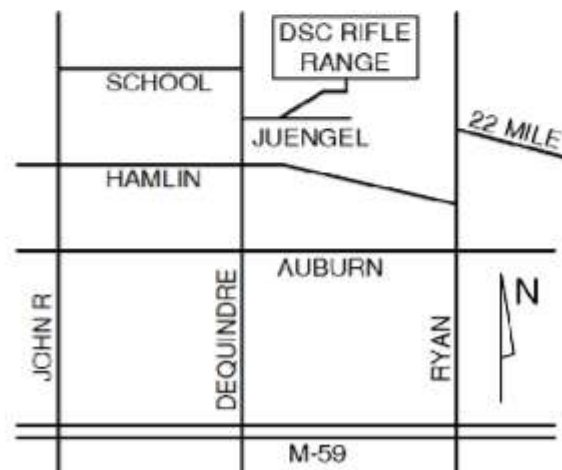

DETROIT SPORTSMEN'S CONGRESS ~ GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING ~ Aug. 5, 2026

President (Mr. Saylor): Asked for a moment of silence for four recently passed members: Mr. Russ Maes, Mr. Dewayne Howell, Mr. Larry Kasica and Mr. George Bench. The past presidents and life members present were recognized. He also reported good progress has been made with the city to get the new enclosed (& heated) 5-stand building permit approved – it has already been staked out to prepare for construction. Materials will be procured after approval.

1st Vice President: (J. Klobuchar) The new enclosed 5-stand structure will need volunteer member help to complete – a great opportunity for work hours. Contact him or the committees to see where you can help. Also, help with the numerous painting projects is always needed too – contact Jim Estes. Reminder given to report repair issues that the committee cannot do themselves. Report issues with equipment as well. Mr. Klobuchar mentioned that August is national shooting month.

2nd Vice President: (R. Plante - not present) Ms. Palmer reminded all committees (and their safety reps) that safety books (with IR sheets) need to be available; fire extinguishers & AEDs need to be checked monthly; and first aid kits checked and stocked as well.

Secretary's Report: (T. Crockatt) Reminded members that the (May) meeting minutes are in the P&K and in the clubhouse.

Treasurer's Report: (R. Savo – not present) President Saylor gave the reminder that financial reports are always posted and available at the bar. The posted June financials are income = \$79,068; expenses = \$97,474; net = \$(18,406).

YTD: income = \$765,764; expenses = \$440,855; net = \$324,909.

Trustee: (T. Murphy) No report.

Trustee: (E. Silarski) No report.

Trustee: (C. Salo) Not present.

Chairman's Report: (J. Lupi) The BOD met on July 27th and discussed the below motions and business items:

Motion to approve spending \$3000 immediately to advertise the business manager position – approved.

Motion to approve Rifle SOP changes (grammatical only) – postponed 1 month.

Motion to revise DSC SOP article III, section 3.01(a) regarding business manager's responsibilities – postponed until Sept.

Motions (2) to approve both the April, then the May income statements – both approved.

Motion to approve a \$600 gift basket for the Marine Corps League detachment 154 golf outing – approved.

Motion to approve the budgeted \$8600 for campground beach sand repair & replacement – approved.

There were also 2 major discussions at the July BOD meeting, the first regarding a motion from the March 2025 BOD allowing open shooting Pistol RSOs to shoot for just the \$1 environmental fee (under very specific circumstances). The April 2025 BOD paused the March motion for 1 year requesting Pistol's assessment of its impact. At the July 27, 2026 BOD meeting the pistol committee submitted its assessment, which the BOD determined to be complete. Subsequently, the BOD agreed that the original March 2025 motion would go into effect for open shooting Pistol RSOs. The second discussion was a review of law enforcement (LE) rentals and their impact on DSC operations and finances. Chairman Lupi made it very clear that LE rentals were vital to DSC's finances and presented a brief analysis. Key point is that LE rentals generated income in 2025 of \$63k, which is expected to grow to more than \$70k for 2026. LE rental income incurs very little expense. This compares to other 2025 DSC income sources as follows: 42% from range fees & dues / 28% from campground / 14% from sales / 7% from LE rentals / 9% from other. Chairman Lupi also stated that loss or reduction in LE rental income would need to be made up from other sources (a significant challenge). He also stressed that law enforcement agencies are our very welcome guests and need to be treated as such. And under no circumstances are they to be directly approached, questioned, or bothered as their training at our facilities is closed to the public – including DSC members. Any questions regarding LE rentals should be directed to the DSC office.

Operations Manager: Ms. Palmer mentioned her upcoming retirement at 2026 years end. She requested each committee submit the name(s) of their respective safety officers / safety committee reps asap. President Saylor was wished a happy birthday (Friday of this week). Also announced was that Tom VanHoven was back cutting grass.

Member of the Month: Charlie Massey.

New Members: Mr. Frank Ring, Mr. Mike Jones, and Mr. Bejeir Brooks were welcomed to DSC.

Committee Reports:

Archery: No report (shooting Mondays).

Black Powder: Monday evening open shooting outdoors on the rifle range – and every other Thursday will be on the 50 yd (pistol) range. Tuesday rendezvous are on-going. Aug. 15 will be a centerfire pistol woods walk.

Campground: New manager has been hired: Bill and Melissa O'Neil.

Clubhouse: Mr. Klobuchar reported on plans for a 90th anniversary dinner in October or November – say tuned

Life Member: No report.

Cowboy: Cowboy is practicing outdoors Saturday's 10 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. – dependent on weather. Now 2/3rds though the match season. Then "wild bunch" match on Aug. 23.

Membership & Show, Conservation: Mr. Duey announced the next new member is Aug. 16 @ 1pm in clubhouse. Conservation topics mentioned: July DNR updates on lighthouses. DNR announced arrest of an individual for various charges. DNR public meeting schedule is listed. Annual Grand Haven Coast Guard festival. Several water rescues were reported highlighting the need for vigilance and awareness when contemplating venturing out on the water: a sailboat foundering off Harrisville;; a kayak being blown further off-

shore by high winds, as well as a paddle boarder blown offshore. Not my species webinars are continuing. Canadian and western US wildfires will create unhealthy smoke condition in Mich. EGLE has issued new permits for Line 5. Deer tag process has changed and now includes a phone app. DNR announced new fishing app for phones. Lots of seminars scheduled, including on a new invasive species: "mile a minute" weed that can grow 6 inches in 24 hours. DNR announced new hours and some reductions for waterfowl areas. Week of Aug. 10 is Mich. hunter safety education week (note that the DSC hunter ed class is Sept. 19 & 20).

Education: Next quarterly committee meeting is Aug. 13 at 7 p.m. range building. All committees need to submit their 2027 class dates asap to support development of the 2027 calendar. Mr. Blankenburg reported that episode #5 of the "Bullseye & Broadhead" podcast was just published – and noted the podcast has now been viewed in 61 cities and multiple countries. Next RSO class is Saturday Oct. 17. There is a CPL refresher class Aug. 18. September CPL and pistol classes: Basic pistol (13), CPL (14, 15, & 21); CPL-R (22). Open shooting is Saturday's & Sunday's 11 a.m. – 4 p.m. (most weekends). There was a CMP GSSM match May 17, a CMP carbine match June 28, and also a "Patriots Day" shoot. The Junior rifle match was May 31. Check the P&K as well as the rifle committee calendar and website for specifics. Next committee meeting is tomorrow night at 7:30 p.m.

Skeet & Trap: Mr. Klobuchar mentioned that monthly fun shoots are being run on the last Sunday every month. Upcoming fun shoot will be "follow-the-leader" on 5 stand. And a new shotgun event has started: "make-a-break" – where 2 shooters strategize how best to outscore the other. The recent shotgun class was successful. President Saylor reported on the Junior shotgun program that added 3 new shooters which now totals 12. DSC juniors (Tong Tong and Enze Tong) both shot very well at the Mich. championships. She shot the 1st 100 straight, then a 2nd 93 (=193). She and her brother both made the all-state team. At the nationals, both shot well: He shot a 191 (vs 300 competitors) placing 18th. She shot 193 (vs 600 competitors). Congratulations to both.

Fees: DSC junior \$6, DSC work hour \$10, non-member \$24, and non-member junior \$7.

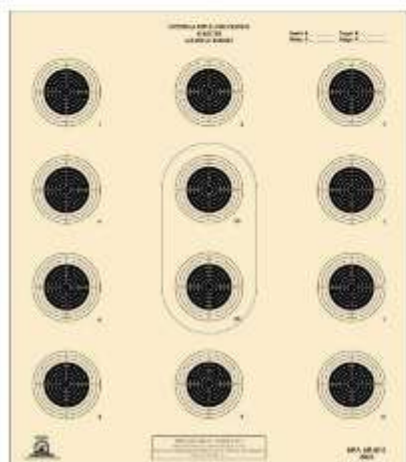
